The new team will be called the "Urban Forestry Program".


This will establish a united team dedicated to the protection of our urban canopy.

TRANSITION PLAN


Our departments will work together to ensure a smooth transition of the positions into the Public Works Department and provide continued support for personnel until this transition is complete.
