- 2.) Celebratory concert by acclaimed Cuban saxophonist Paquito D'Rivera and his jazz quintet, Sunday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2006 at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts in Gainesville, Florida.
- \*\* Artist Lecture by Paquito D'Rivera Sunday afternoon, September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2006. Open to all high school and college students.

## Danging in Freedom's Shoes"

Film Synopsis: Dancing In Freedom's Shoes is the dramatic story of two beloved Cuban artists who sought to create a unique style of dance that celebrated their Cuban heritage, but whose lives changed dramatically following the production of Alonso's revolutionary ballet, Carmen, at the famous Bolshoi Theater. Unable to work freely as artists under the Castro regime, and afraid for their son's future, they found asylum in America following their son's defection by raft in 1993. The couple found a new home and careers at Santa Fe Community College where Alberto serves as Master-Artist-In-Residence and Sonia teaches salsa and other popular dance classes. The film concludes with Alonso's triumphant return to the Boshoi for the November 2005 re-premiere of his Carmen. The only non-Russian ever commissioned to choreograph for the Bolshoi, Alonso receives a standing ovation, marking his family's personal triumph of artistic and personal freedom.
