



Office of Mayor Edward B. Braddy PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on June 14, 1777, in order to establish an official flag for the new nation, the Continental Congress passed the first Flag Act: "Resolved, that the flag of the United States be made of thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new Constellation; and

WHEREAS, in following years, New York City kindergarten teacher George Balch planned ceremonies for the children of his school, which were later adopted by the State Board of Education, the Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia, the Pennsylvania Societies of the Sons of the Revolution and Colonial Dames of America and others began to spread the celebration of the flag; and

WHEREAS, President Harry S. Truman signed an Act of Congress in 1947, designating June 14th as National Flag Day; and

WHEREAS, the Stars and Stripes continue to fly proudly over our nation's capitol, throughout the United States and on our embassies, bases and ships throughout the world, representing the hopes and dreams of all who desire freedom and liberty.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward B. Braddy, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim June 14, 2014 as

in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me as we commemorate this national holiday, by proudly flying the American Flag throughout our community and keeping the last lines of the Star Spangled Banner a message of truth and hope—— "And the Star Spangled Banner in Triumph Shall Wave, O'er the Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave."
