Mayor and City Commission

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending Chapter 23, Article 2, Section 23-30 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville relating to

Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places by adding minimum height

requirements on numerals for all new and existing buildings and structures; making amendment to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville to be consistent with 2000 edition of the Florida Fire Prevention Code adopted by the Florida Legislature; providing an exception for existing number when approved by the City Fire Inspector; providing directions to the codifier; providing a

severability clause; a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective

date.

Recommendation: The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

At its meeting of April 8, 2002, the City Commission authorized the City Attorney to draft and the Clerk of the Commission to advertise an ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances relating to the posting of building address numbers.

16	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a
17	newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and a
18	Public Hearing in the Auditorium of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and the City
19	Plan Board authorized the publication of notice of a Public Hearing that the text of the
20	Land Development Code of the City of Gainesville, Florida, be amended; and
21	WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice
22	described at which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be
23	and were, in fact, heard.
24	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION
25	OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
26	Section 1. Section 23-30 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is
27	hereby amended to read as follows:
28	Sec. 23-30. Posting of Numbers.
29	All buildings in the incorporated area of Gainesville shall have their assigned
30	building number properly displayed, whether or not mail is delivered to such building or

- 1 property. It shall be the duty of the owners of each building in the incorporated area to
- 2 post the assigned building number on the property in the following manner:
- New and existing buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a
- 4 position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property,
- 5 whether or not mail is delivered to such building or property. These numbers shall
- 6 contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet
- 7 letters. It shall be the duty of the owners of each building in the incorporated area to post
- 8 the assigned building number on the property in the following manner:
- 9 (1) The building (address) number shall be affixed to the front of the building, or to a
- separate structure in front of the building (such as mailbox, post, wall, fence, etc.), in
- such a manner so as to be clearly visible and legible from the public or private way on
- which the building fronts.
- 13 (2) Numerals shall be Arabic and shall not be less than three (3) inches in height and
- one-half inch in stroke width for residential buildings, structures, or portions thereof, and
- 15 at least six (six) inches in height for all other buildings, structures, or portions thereof.
- 16 Where address identification is required by the fire official on other elevations of
- buildings, structures, or portions thereof, such numerals shall be not less than three (3)
- inches in height for residential and at least six (6) inches in height for all other buildings,
- 19 structures, or portions thereof. Existing numbers may be exempt if approved by the City
- 20 Fire Inspector.
- 21 (3) The numerals shall be of a contrasting color with the immediate background of the
- building or structure on which such numerals are affixed.

1	(4) Any address numbering done pursuant to section 23-21 of the Gainesville Code of
2	Ordinances shall be in addition to the requirements of this division.
3	Section 2. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of
4	Section 1 of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of
5	the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Section and Paragraphs of this ordinance
6	may be renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.
7	Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be
8	invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall
9	in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
10	Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the
11	extent of such conflict hereby repealed.
12	Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final
13	adoption.
