Unappropriated Fund Balances

• Additional funding of \$720,348 available due primarily to interest earned that past few years that was not appropriated

Payroll & Operating Expenses

- Increase of two staff positions proposed
- Proposed position (title-TBD) will focus on CPUH area and projects and be funded by CPUH.
- Proposed position (title-TBD) would focus on real estate and economic development across all redevelopment areas and help with the increased number of CRA projects. All areas would cover proportional share of the Personal Services expense for this position.
- The Operating/Payroll to Tax Increment % is 20.48%, below the self-imposed 25%

Model Block Program – Sites C, E, F, G, H, and I	\$24,000 (\$4k/site)	To prepare conceptual site plans and preliminary design services for the remaining Model Block houses.
A. Quinn Jones	\$25,000	To begin restoration of house in preparation to turn the historic home into an African-American museum. This is additional funding to bring balance to \$44,000. The funding is a 50% match with the City of Gainesville's Parks Department.
NW 5th Ave Streetscape	\$150,000	To continue the 5th Ave streetscape from NW 6th St to NW 10th St (or NW 13th St). Involves installing brick pavers, new lights, and undergrounding utilities.
