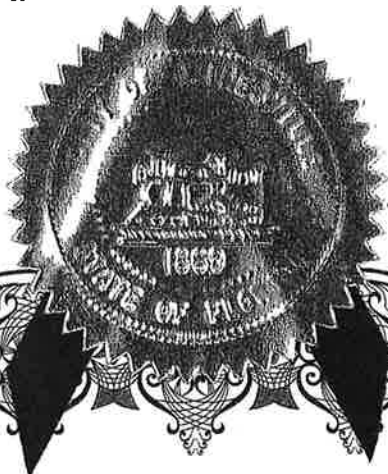
WHEREAS, this year's theme, "Working in the Public Interest," is a tribute to the positive improvements public works employees have made to our communities.
