SECURITY CAMERAS IN PUBLIC PLACES

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville repealing Section 21-10,

relating to use of television surveillance equipment in

investigation and detection of crime; providing an immediate

effective date.

RECOMMENDATION: The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

On September 26, 2005, the City Commission authorized the City Attorney to draft, and the Clerk of the Commission to advertise a rescission of ordinance Section 21-10.

The Public Safety Committee discussed this July 25, 2005 referral and request from the Gainesville Police Department to rescind Section 21-10 of the Code of Ordinance. This section of the ordinance prohibits police use of video surveillance in public places and in common areas of private property, even at the request of the private property owner. Staff believes that this ordinance, enacted in 1960, likely referred to a specific piece of equipment for a specific purpose at that time and is not relevant to, nor functional in present-day situations.

9	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a
10	newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a
11 12	Public Hearing in the City Commission Auditorium in City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
13	WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice
14 15	described at which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard;

17	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF
18	THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA;
10	THE CITT OF GAMALS VIELE, I LONIDAL,
19	Section 1. Section 21-10 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is
20	repealed in its entirety as follows:
21	
22	Sec. 21-10. Use of television surveillance equipment in investigation and detection of
23	crime.
24	
25	(a) Statement of purpose. The city manager has been authorized to acquire for
26	use by personnel of the city police department, certain electronic equipment consisting of
27	closed circuit television apparatus and appurtenances (collectively referred to in this
28	section as surveillance equipment) to be used in the course of investigation and detection
29	of crime, such as burglary or similar type crime, through means of surveillance by the use
30	of such equipment. This section is passed to ensure that the equipment will be used only
31	for its intended purposes.
32	
33	(b) Uses, prohibitions and procedures:
34	
35	(1) The surveillance equipment shall be used only in the surveillance of
36	business or professional facilities and shall not, under any circumstances, be used
37	on public streets or for the surveillance at any place of domestic relations, nor
38	shall the surveillance equipment be used for any purpose in any residential
39	location, including apartments, motels, hotels, single family residences or
40	multifamily residences. The surveillance equipment shall not be used for
41	surveillance of classrooms, meeting rooms or hallways of public facilities, such as
42	schools or colleges, but the same may be used for the surveillance of storage

1	areas, maintenance areas and similar areas which might reasonably be subject to
2	burglary.
-3	(2) The surveillance equipment shall not be placed in any location without the
4	prior written consent of the owner or person in charge, if other than the owner.
5	
6	(3) Key employees of a facility where the surveillance equipment is placed
7	will be informed of the police operations unless reasonable grounds indicate an
8	employee may be a suspect. Other employees will be notified on a need to know
9	basis as determined by the city police department.
10	
11	(4) The surveillance equipment will be used during nonbusiness hours only,
12	unless an installation is made in a warehouse or storage type facility where
13	normal routine business is not carried on during the day or during normal business
14	hours.
15	
16	(5) The surveillance equipment will be placed in accordance with criteria
17	developed under the computer burglary prediction program and police
18	information regarding possible burglaries. The decision as to whether the
19	equipment will be placed in a particular establishment will be made by the city
20	and not simply on the basis of a request by the owner or manager of the facility.

22	(6)The surveillance equipment will be used only for the purpose of its intended
23	design.
24	
25	(7)The surveillance equipment will not be loaned to or permitted to be used by
26	other law enforcement agencies unless it is used in accordance with city
27	ordinances and policies and under the supervision of a member of the police
28	department. Under no other circumstances may the surveillance equipment be
29	used or permitted to be used by any person or agency.
30	
31	(8)The city manager shall make quarterly reports to the city commission
32	regarding the use of the equipment to ensure compliance with the provisions of
33	this section.
34	
35	(c)Penalties for violation. It shall be unlawful to use or permit the use of the
36	surveillance equipment in any manner not permitted by this section. Any person
37	convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished as provided in
38	section 1-9.
