- Address Citizen preference from November '02 straw ballot favoring Combining Service, without a Special Taxing District
- Join efforts of Gainesville and Alachua County for future service.

"Fire/Rescue services in the urban area would be consolidated under Gainesville Fire Rescue (GFR). This would be done by a contract with leasing or sale of existing ACFR assets."



- Future Service at 2 levels requires station location study and comprehensive plan amendment.
- Customer satisfaction (accountability)

- FY2004 transition period
 - Some one-time costs
 - Bargaining to single agreements
- FY2005 FY2010
 - Projection based on past growth



Transition Period FY2004

- 10/1/2003 County employees become Gainesville employees (January 1, 2004 as an alternative)
- Cost estimate based on former county employees continuing same union contracts, pension, and benefits.
- Health Insurance, Life insurance and payroll service changed to City of Gainesville plans

One-Time Transition Costs

- Strategic Plan and Station Location Study
- Compatible Breathing Apparatus \$283,000
- Uniforms \$30,170
- Vehicle Re-marking \$18,000
- DSL (computer) Connections \$18,000
- Software transition \$59,000
- Administrative and Training Facilities:
 - Re-location, expansion, or construction



- Quit Claim transfer of assets
- Transfer of Fleet Replacement
 Fund balances

Post-Transition Issues

- Bargaining impacts
- One time costs
- Staffing changes



- All sworn personnel covered by one union contract
 - Kelly Day
 - Paramedic Pay adjustments
 - City Pay Plan
- All non-sworn personnel covered by CWA union contract, or Gainesville professional/managerial pay plans.
- All current ACFR employees projected to select FRS pension system



Gainesville Fire Rescue hires
 3.9 personnel per shift position

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- Prediction is County stations to be staffed at City staffing level
 - 3 personnel on Engines
 - 4 personnel on Aerials

30 additional Firefighters - 18 Fire Rescue, 12 EMS



Single Family Detached Residential Development Permits Issued




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City Costs to FY2010


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
Without Merger

Future Policy Issues

- Negotiate new agreement with County to replace and liquidate current DAA
- Provide for annexation adjustments

- Provide for addition of new stations when needed
- Provide for service into surrounding municipalities when needed

Proposed Future County Reimbursement

- Initial Cost of Service (as negotiated)
- Increased each year by the higher of the increase in the Departmental Budget or CPI
 - If increase is greater than 5%, County Commission approval required (same as CCC agreement)

Recommendation

- #140101F
- Draft an agreement by 8/1/2003
- Employees and control transferred effective 10/1/2003 (or January 1, 2004 as an alternative)
- Implementation of full merger by 10/1/2004
