NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas D. Bussing, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim April 22-28, 2002 as CRIME VICTIMS RIGHTS WEEK in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me in celebrating victim's voices as an important chorus for fairness and dignity; and be it further resolved, that we will continue to strive for justice and compassion for crime victims as individuals, as communities, and as a nation dedicated to justice for all.
