



# Improvements for Pedestrian Safety

Public Works Department

- Signalized midblock crossings;
- New sidewalks citywide;
- ADA compliant access;
- Outreach campaign;
- Targeted enforcement;
- Infrastructure improvements identified in the bicycle and pedestrian safety action plan;
- Roundabout access;
- Bike boxes

**Estimated Cost: \$5,025,000**

Installation of signalized midblock crossings along major corridors with high transit ridership to facilitate pedestrian access to/from RTS bus stops and increase motorist awareness

## HAWK: High-Intensity Activated Crosswalk

\$150,000 per installation



## RRFB: Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon

\$37,000 per installation





# Sidewalks

Partnerships to continue to develop the system to close gaps and reduce conflicts with vehicles; several segments planned. Funded through a variety of sources – CIP, TCEA, CDBG, FDOT, grants.
