Assistant City Manager Fred Murry introduced this as a program for low-income residents and asked that the Committee consider recommending to the City Commission that we try the program for 18 months and then have staff return with results for long-term consideration. Rick Hutton of Gainesville Regional Utilities

explained the proposed program and answered questions along with Jackie Richardson from Housing and Community Development. Commissioner Wells recommended that the committee accept the proposed median income level for "low income" at 80% but that staff be given the flexibility to make decisions regarding income-level eligibility, the selection of the grant rather than the recapture loan, the threshold for notification to the City Commission of major project of \$50K or more, and the cap for neighborhood projects being set at potential customers and 60% participation, and that staff report back in eighteen months with results up to that point.

Commissioner Wells suggested that septic tank repair is something that should be discussed separately, as he doesn't feel it relates to Connect Free, and Commissioner Carter agreed. Commissioner Wells asked that, if possible, staff return with a report on the scope of potential septic repair issues and an explanation of how the City discovers septic tank repair needs among low-income citizens.

RECOMMENDATION

The Community Development Committee review the Water/Wastewater Connection Program Guidelines and take appropriate action concerning the development of the program.

Assistant City Manager Fred Murry introduced the continuation of this topic from the previous CDC meeting and stated that one of the items staff was tasked with researching, the permit revocation process, requires more time before discussion, but that the Special Magistrate should continue to make determinations as necessary in the meantime.

Chris Cooper presented some updates on this topic. The Committee has already made some significant progress, including revision to the late fee, reduction of the permit fee overall, and multiple-unit discounts. Mr. Cooper then recommended that an amendment be made to the ordinance stating that no permit is necessary if the unit is occupied by the owner (as verified by homestead exemption) and if the unit is occupied by immediate family members (excluding cousins, nieces, and nephews), if unrelated roommates move in to a home where the owner does not live but a relative of the owner does, a permit is required. There was no consensus on this point but the Committee is comfortable with this moving forward to the Commission.

The Committee would like to have the City Commission consider giving a discount to landlords who rent to HUD, Section-8, Meridian voucher clients. The Committee would also be interested in having the Commission consider inclusion of "nieces" and

"nephews" as part of the inclusive family definition. Stakeholders will need to provide relevant numbers for both these considerations.

It was agreed that a special CDC meeting should be held to discuss only the maximum occupancy issue.

Citizen Erica Husak provided an informational presentation on the business concept of the cycle pub and the benefits it could bring to the City of Gainesville.
