# History – How did we get here?

#### In the 1990's:

- Many City & County residents lobbied for alternatives to landfilling waste in Alachua County
- Residents wanted to reduce waste generated and maximize recycling
- waste management services Residents wanted environmentally responsible solid
- responsible, government owned and managed landfill Community desired to contract with an environmentally



# History – How did we get here?

#### Decisions were made:

- To develop and size a solid waste disposal facility to sately and economically serve the needs of the entire population of the County – Environmental Park
- To implement metal, yard waste and tire recycling as part of environmental park
- responsible, government owned and managed landfill To contract with New River as an environmentally



# History – How did we get here?

#### Decisions were made (continued):

- For City and County to enter into interlocal agreement for County to provide waste disposal
- To continue a volume based residential collection system
- To continue to jointly bid for curbside collection services
- Lower cost due to economy of scale
- Seamless delivery of services to our residents
- To implement mandatory commercial recycling
- To increase public awareness of alternatives to waste disposal through education



## Commitments under Interlocal

- City Commitments, Interlocal Art. IV
- To direct all residential waste collected within City to **Environmental Park**
- To direct all commercial waste collected through contracts or exclusive franchises to Environmental



## Commitments under Interlocal

- County Commitments, Interlocal Art. III
- Fla. Stat. §403.706: County has authority & responsibility for solid waste disposal
- To size Environmental Park to accommodate unincorporated county & City's waste
- To provide City with environmentally-responsible solid waste management services
- To allow City to use any of County-owned recovered materials processing facilities
- To supervise operations under Board of County Commissioners
- To charge agreed-to rate structure



# Commitments under New River Agreement

#### County

- To deliver all acceptable waste within its control
- Permitted diversion of any & all recycling, recovered materials, organic materials
- New River
- To provide safe, permitted disposal site
