Handbill Ordinance Assessment

An assessment of the Handbill ordinance will be discussed at the December 15<sup>th</sup> Public Safety meeting. This review was decided when enacted to determine the effectiveness of the ordinance on what was a citizen based concern brought to the attention of the Public Safety committee.

During the year 2005 the Gainesville Police Department handled eighteen (18) complaints. Virtually all complaints originated in the southwest area of the city inclusive of the area annexed in 2001 and heavily represented by those who originally brought the issue forward. The majority of complaints originated from apartment complex personnel, and were responded to by GPD personnel. A few were proactively handled by GPD staff who observed the violations. In ten (10) cases citations were issued and fines collected.

Approximately twenty (20) surveys were conducted by GPD of apartment complexes in District 3 that have properly posted for no handbills. All responses were positive and all felt the ordinance had made a positive impact on the problem. Managers have observed a vast reduction in the amount and frequency of handbills in their areas and have handled many incidents themselves by educating establishments on the ordinance. The deterrent factor was noted as well.

Due to the volume of complaints in a year time frame, it would appear the compliance rate is high and the ordinance has proven effective.

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, creating Article VI, of Chapter 19 of the City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, establishing requirements related to the "Distribution of Handbills"; providing for the intent and purpose of the regulations; providing for definitions; providing for the scope of the program; prohibiting distribution where an occupant has posted a "No Handbills" sign; providing exceptions for consent, parcel carriers, postal carriers, and qualified newspapers; providing for enforcement by civil citation and a penalty for violation of this Ordinance; providing for enforcement by municipal ordinance prosecution following two civil citation convictions; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the distribution of handbills and circulars creates litter problems

which are not adequately addressed by present laws; and

WHEREAS, the distribution and accumulation of handbills creates security and safety concerns for businesses and residential dwellings within the City of Gainesville which are not adequately addressed by present laws; and

WHEREAS, the distribution of handbills subjects unwilling property owners to unsolicited literature and advertisements they do not wish to receive; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Gainesville wishes to improve the general cleanliness of the City, ensure the safety of its citizens and visitors, enhance the privacy of its citizens, protect property owners from annoyance, including intrusion on their property, and the prevention of crime; and

WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a Public Hearing in the Auditorium of City Hall in the City of Gamesville; and
