

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, jazz has played a significant role in the cultural and social history of America; and

WHEREAS, Gainesville Friends of Jazz and Blues, a not for profit corporation, founded in 1983, is dedicated to support, promote, and increase public awareness, education, and participation in jazz, America's music; and

WHEREAS, Gainesville Friends of Jazz & Blues has been bringing premier jazz musicians to our community for concerts and school clinics for over 20 years; and

WHEREAS, the month of April is the birth month of such jazz greats as Duke Ellington, Ella Fitzgerald, Herbie Hancock, Billie Holliday, Charles Mingus, Gerry Mulligan, Tito Puente and Bessie Smith; and

WHEREAS, the Smithsonian Institution National Museum of American History, along with partners, including the U.S. Department of Education, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Association of Music Education, the International Association of Jazz Educators and the Grammy Foundation have designated April as Jazz Appreciation Month to draw greater public attention to the extraordinary heritage and history of jazz as both a historic and living American art form.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Pegeen Hanrahan, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim April 2005 as
