Re: Walnut Creek Development and impact on Hidden Pines

Dear Ms. Mayor and City Commissioners,

We are meeting tonight to consider the plat for the Walnut Creek Subdivision. The final plat for this subdivision has a major impact on the communities that have been already developed along Glen Springs Road, but none are more affected than the residents of Hidden Pines. We have done a survey of the residents of Hidden Pines to bring to your attention their will relative to one central issue, the connectivity between Hidden Pines and Walnut Creek. No survey of this type has been made before. The vast majority of Hidden Pines residents only realized that the impending development would drastically impact their neighborhood when they were surveyed last fall to determine where they wanted sidewalks and traffic calming devices placed in the streets in front of their homes.

A copy of our survey instrument is attached. We handed out 73 of these questionnaires, one per household, and had 54 returned. The response represents 74% of the households. The choices given to select from were three: 1) DO NOT open NW 27th St to Walnut Creek and 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue; 2) Open NW 27th St. to Walnut Creek and 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue; and 3) Open NW 27th St. to Walnut Creek for pedestrians and emergency vehicles only (i.e. limited access). Those who responded had the opportunity to choose both a first and second choice and to make comments. The results were as follows:

The most striking result of this survey was that not one household responding to the survey wanted to be connected. Comments were given by 33 of those responding. expressing concern for safety of the children, neighborhood tranquility, wheelchair access to the whole neighborhood, and increased crime. The will of the nearly 80 households most affected is pretty clear. We hope that you as our civil servants will hear them and ensure that the plans for Walnut Creek are adjusted taking into account their concerns.




