21	Call in towing shall mean towing or removal of a vehicle that is parked on private
22	real property, without the consent of the vehicle's registered owner or other legally

2	private property owner or designee, who does not have a prior contractual, oral or written
3	arrangement is not affiliated with a trespass towing service tow company.
4	Emergency towing as used in this article shall only include circumstances where the
5	usual operation of a business is impeded by the blocking of entrances, exits or access to
6	operational equipment, but specifically shall not include tows for the purpose of clearing
7	parking areas.
8	Major credit card means a Visa and MasterCard.
9	Normal business hours shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
10	Physically connected as used in this article shall mean that at least two of the
11	vehicle's wheels are raised from the ground and the connection is in compliance with the
12	requirements of F.S. § Section 316.222, Florida Statutes (related to stop lamps and turn
13	signals) and F.S. § Section 316.525 Florida Statutes (requirements for vehicles hauling
14	loads).
15	Property owner means the person who exercises dominion and control over the real
16	property, including, but not limited to, the legal title holder, lessee, a resident manager, a
17	property manager or other agent who has legal authority to bind the owner. An owner,
18	operator, or other agent or employee of a trespass towing service or immobilization service,
19	or any person with any affiliation with a towing service or immobilization service, may not
20	be appointed as an agent for a property.
21	Roam towing shall mean shall mean towing or removal of a vehicle that is parked on
22	private real property, without the consent of the vehicle's registered owner or other legally
23	authorized person in control of the vehicle, when the tow was not specifically requested by

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1	Tow shall mean to haul, carry, pull along, or otherwise transport a connected vehicle
2	by means of another vehicle in a direct and continuous movement to the storage site of the
3	towing or immobilization service and applies only to private property or trespass tows as

5	Tow business shall mean the owner, whether individual, partner, shareholder, or
6	corporation, which manages or owns a business which engages in offering wrecker services
7	and/or towing of vehicles for money or other goods of value.
8	Tow Operator shall mean a person who is operating a tow truck for hire to tow
9	vehicles from one place to another, at a cost to either the requesting party or the registered
10	owner of the vehicle.
11	Towing administrator shall mean the person(s) appointed by the chief of police City
12	Manager or his designee, to administer Article III of this chapterregulating towing or
13	immobilization on private property.
14	Trespass towing shall mean towing or removal of a vehicle that is parked on private
15	real property, without the consent of the vehicle's registered owner or other legally authorized
16	person in control of the vehicle operator. Trespass towing includes "roam" towing and "call
17	in" towing.
18	Trespass towing service includes any person, owner, whether individual, partner,
19	shareholder, corporation, company corporation, or other entity, whether licensed or not, who
20	engages in or who owns or operates a business which engages, in whole or in part, in the
21	towing of vehicles for compensation from private property and does not apply to
22	repossessions, or to the towing or removal of any privately owned vehicle by the operator or
23	of any vehicle towing or removal service when such service is performed at the request of the
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registered owner of the vehicle, for money or other goods of value.

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1	Violation as used in this article shall mean an uncontested citation, or the conviction
2	of, or a plea of nolo contendere to a violation violating of this article, regardless of
3	adjudication of guilt.
4	Sec. 14.5-26 Owner, operator and vehicle registration provisions.
5	1. It shall be unlawful for Prior to performing any trespass towing, the trespass towing
6	service shall any person, either as principal, agent or employee, to perform any trespass
7	towing without having first registered the owner, wrecker tow operators and towing service
8	vehicles with the police department towing administrator, using a format approved by the
9	police department towing administrator. The information for registration shall contain the
10	make, model and manufacturer's serial number of the vehicle; date the vehicle was put into
11	service; the driver's license number of the owner and the name of the insurance company or
12	companies with which the owner and operators have liability insurance for the operation of
13	the vehicle as required by law; and the name and driver's license number of all employees
14	involved in the towing of vehicles as defined in the trespass tow ordinance.
15	2. It shall be unlawful for any person, either as principal, agent or employee:
16	(a) to perform any trespass towing without having first registered as required in
17	section 1 above, and or
18	(b) to operate a trespass tow service or act as a trespass tow operator, without
19	having first obtained either a trespass tow business owner permit and/or
20	trespass tow operator permit.
21	3. Registration fees shall be as provided in a Appendix A, Schedule of Fees, Rates and
22	Charges.
23	Sec. 14.5-27 Application for Tow wrecker operator's permit and trespass towing service
24	permit; violations.

1	(a)	No wrecker tow operator shall engage in trespass towing without first having
2		obtained a wrecker trespass tow operator authorization permit from the
3		towing service by whom owner of the company such tow operator is
4		employed, or such towing service's owner's authorized designee, and then
5		obtaining a tow operator permit from the towing administrator.
6	<u>(b)</u>	No tow business shall engage in trespass towing without having first obtained
7		a trespass towing service permit.
8	<u>(c)</u>	The trespass towing service permit and tow operator permit Each permit will
9		meet the following specifications:
10		(1) Be not less than 21/8 inches by 33/8 inches.

8	engage in trespass towing which has been validated by the chief of
9	police or designee.

13	(e) Upon issuance of the permits, the tow business and/or tow wrecker operator is

15	the City of Gainesville, Florida, unless such permit expires or is suspended or
16	revoked, as provided in this article. Each permit shall be expire on September
17	30 th of each year. valid for two years from date of issuance
18	Any permit issued prior to October 1, 2013 shall be valid until September 30,
19	2013 unless it expires, is suspended or revoked prior to that date. The cost of
20	the permit issued on October 1, 2013, shall be waived if the applicant has a
21	valid trespass towing service or tow operator permit which was issued on or
22	between September 1, 2012 and September 30, 2013.
23	(eg) In order to secure a trespass towing service permit or trespass tow wrecker
24	operator permit, an applicant must provide the following information on a
25	form provided by the eity tow administrator. The applicant must:

1	(1)	Submit to the tow administrator chief of police or designee a certified
2		copy from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement of his/her
3		criminal history and a certified copy of his/her driving record from
4		the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles;

6		and provide a photocopy to the towing administrator chief of police or
7		designee.
8	(3)	Not have been convicted of, found guilty of, or pled guilty or nolo

10		contendere to, or had adjudication withheld for or been incarcerated
11		after any conviction, plea of nolo contendere or adjudication withheld

8	Sec. 14.5-28 Revocation; appeal.
9	(a) The city may revoke the <u>privilege permit</u> of any person, <u>entity or company</u> to perform
10	trespass towing on any of the following grounds:
11	(1) If the <u>trespass</u> towing service owner and/or <u>tow</u> operator fails to register <u>or to</u>
12	obtain the required permits as required by this article;
13	(2) If the registration or permit application contains a false statement of material
14	fact;
15	(3) If the <u>trespass</u> towing service owner and/or wrecker tow operator provides
16	monetary or other valuable consideration to the private property owner for the
17	privilege of towing vehicles from the property under contract;
18	(4) The <u>trespass</u> towing service owner and/or <u>tow</u> operator provides monetary or
19	other valuable consideration to the private property owner for each or any
20	individual vehicle towed from the property;
21	(5) If the <u>trespass towing</u> service <u>owner</u> and/or <u>wrecker tow</u> operator charges
22	fees in excess of that set out in the police section of appendix A, Schedule of
23	Fees, Rates and Charges of this Code of Ordinances current resolution of the

Sec. 14.5-29. - Prerequisites to towing vehicles parked on private property; exceptions.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) below, # it shall be unlawful for any trespass towing service, tow operator or any person to tow or cause to be towed any vehicle parked on private real property without the consent of the registered owner or other legally authorized person in control of the vehicle, unless the provisions of F.S. §

1	Section 715.07, Florida Statutes, have been strictly complied with together with the
2	following requirements:
3	(1) The owners of the real property shall have executed, and filed with the towing
4	administrator, at least 24 hours prior to the towing or removal of any vehicle,
5	a written agreement for trespass towing with a towing service, which
6	agreement shall contain the following provisions:
7	a. The duration of the agreement;
8	b. The time of day that such towing or removal is authorized;
9	c. The days of the week that such towing or removal is authorized;
10	d. The fees to be paid for the towing or removal;
11	e. The signatures of both the property owner or the authorized
12	representative, and the owner, or authorized representative of the
13	towing service, certifying that each has read and is in compliance with
14	all of the provisions of F.S. § Section 715.07, Florida Statutes.
15	The form for such agreement shall be provided by the towing administrator
16	police department, and may not be amended or modified in any manner that
17	provides for terms or activities that violate the provisions of this article or
18	F.S. § Section 715.07, Florida Statutes.
19	(2) A copy of the completed agreement is on file with the towing administrator
20	Gainesville Police Department.
21	a. A new completed agreement is submitted each time a property owner
22	changes trespass towing services, tow vendors or the ownership or
23	management of the property changes.
24	b. A completed agreement is resubmitted annually, one year from the
25	date of last submittal.

1	c. Each time a new or updated agreement is filed, a new
2	application/filing fee must be paid by the private property owner.
3	(3) Where the private real property is provided used for residential parking, other
4	than for a single-family residence, the agreement, except as provided in
5	subsection (a)(4) below, shall not authorize the trespass towing service to tow
6	away or remove any vehicle without a verified request to remove the specific
7	vehicle by the property owner or an authorized representative. A property
8	owner's representative may include a resident manager, a property manager or
9	other agent who has the legal authority to bind the owner, but may not be an
10	officer, employee or agent of a trespass towing service.
11	(4) The use of "spotters" who are employees, private contractors, agents, officers
12	or owners of a trespass towing service or tow operator, or are in any way
13	affiliated with a tow business or tow operator, is prohibited.
14	(5) An Owners owner of properties property used for residential purposes may
15	elect to authorize the trespass towing service to tow away or remove vehicles
16	without a verified request to remove a specific vehicle provided that the
17	owner first complies with the following requirements:
18	a. Signage shall be added to each of the existing tow away signs with letters of the same size as the "tow away" language, which provides
19	letters of the same size as the "tow away" language, which provides
20	the following words: "roam towing." The sign shall state the specific
21	hours of roam towing or state 24 hours "24-hours", if that is
22	applicable.
23	b. Towing contract on file with the Gainesville Police Department
24	towing administrator as required by subsection (a)(1) shall be
25	amended to provide for roam towing.

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Photograph(s) of the "offending" vehicle shall be taken prior to its removal and shall be of sufficient detail to demonstrate the violation of rule or regulation for which the vehicle is being towed. The photograph(s) must be date and time stamped and maintained by the wrecker company trespass towing service for a minimum period of one year. Photos will be available for viewing the following business day. Normal hours for viewing the photographs will be Monday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There can be no charge for viewing the photographs when such is done during the first available business day as referenced above.

Lease rental or property owners' association documents shall contain a notice provision indicating that the residential property utilizes roam towing. In the case of properties with existing leases, rental agreements or property owners' association documents, it shall be sufficient to notify by regular mail, at the last known address, each of the tenants/owners of the property prior to the initiation of roam towing. All new leases, rental agreements or property owners' association documents, or amendments thereto, shall contain the provision giving notice that the property owner intends to utilize roam towing.

For private property located within the boundaries of the community redevelopment areas as defined in <u>dDivision</u> 9 of <u>eChapter</u> 2 of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances, signage as required by <u>F.S.</u> § <u>Section</u> 715.07, <u>Florida Statutes</u> and subsection (a) above, shall use reflective white lettering on a non-reflective black background. <u>All existing signs within the</u>

1	redevelopment areas referenced herein shall be replaced on or before January
2	1, 2004.
3	(7) Upon filing the written agreement with the towing administrator police
4	department as required herein, the property owner or the authorized
5	representative of the property owner, shall simultaneously submit an
6	administrative fee to process the trespass towing application in the amount set
7	forth in aAppendix A. The administrative fee shall be applicable to all
8	trespass towing agreements filed with the towing administrator police
9	department after the adoption of this section and shall be paid each time a
10	trespass towing agreement is filed with the towing administrator police
11	department as required herein.
12	(b) The provisions of this <u>section</u> article shall not apply to:
13	(1) The towing of vehicles pursuant to section 3-116, authority to remove

22	(c) The 24-hour notice requirement of this section shall not apply where the tow is of an
23	emergency nature that threatens public safety and the property owner or authorized
24	representative of the <u>trespass towing service</u> tow owner or tow operator has notified
25	the Gainesville Police Department prior to removing the vehicle.

6	(3)	You may inspect your vehicle prior to paying the towing fees. The tow
7		company cannot require you to sign a waiver which would release the firm
8		trespass tow service from liability for damages noted by you at the time the

10		by entry into the vehicle if the entry was not done with the "standard of
11		reasonable care". Proper remedy for these damages is through civil court.
12	(4)	You may pay the towing charges using cash, debit card, or major credit card
13		(Visa or MasterCard). A fee may be charged to use the debit card. No
14	-	additional fee can be charged for use of a credit card.
15	(5)	A detailed, signed receipt showing the legal name of the trespass towing
16		service company, tow operator or person towing the vehicle must be given to
17		you at the time of payment, whether requested or not. The receipt will also

21	(6)	Trespass towing services tow companies are required to take photos of your
22		vehicle prior to tow, documenting the violation for which the vehicle was
23		towed. You can make arrangements with the tow company to see the

25		business day. Normal hours for viewing the photographs will be Monday

1	through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. It is a good idea to make an
2	appointment in advance with the office staff trespass towing service.
3	The document shall also contain contact information to report violations.
4	Sec. 14.5-30 Authorized fees and charges.
5	(a) Any <u>trespass</u> towing <u>service</u> firm engaged in the business of trespass towing shall not
6	charge the owner of any towed vehicle or personal property in excess of the fees set
7	by the eCity eCommission by resolution. The fees set by resolution shall be all
8	inclusive during the first 24-hour period following notification of vehicle tow to the
9	Gainesville Police Department; no additional fees or charges whatsoever may be
10	charged unless specifically established and authorized herein or by state statute. The
11	eCity eCommission shall establish, by resolution, a maximum fee for specific classes
12	of vehicles as identified in the Towing and Recovery Association of America's
13	TRAA Vehicle Identification Guide. After maximum fees are initially established
14	using the TRAA Vehicle Identification Guide, such maximum fees will be subject to
15	rate review as provided in sSubsection 14.5-30(c), notwithstanding that such review
16	may occur less than annually for the first instance.
17	(b) A trespass towing service person, operator, firm, or corporation that provides trespass
18	towing and storage services pursuant to <u>aArticle III</u> , <u>sSection 14.5-25</u> , et. seq. of the
19	Gainesville Code of Ordinances shall accept payment for charges from the registered
20	vehicle owner or authorized representative in any of the following forms:
21	(1) Cash;
22	(2) Major credit card; and/or
23	(3) Debit card.

(c) Maximum trespass towing fees shall be established no more than annually by the eCity eCommission after receiving a request for fee modification by the trespass towing service towing company owners and staff recommendations based on financial information, including, but not limited to, average cost analysis per trespass tow, submitted by the trespass towing service eompanies as to their costs for the removal of vehicles and on other information. The required information shall be submitted by the trespass towing service towing company owners by September 30th of each year. The maximum fees shall be set by resolution to be adopted by the eCity eCommission prior to December β1st of each year in which a request for modification has been made. Such maximum fees shall be effective during the following calendar year and until changed by subsequent resolution.

Sec. 14.5-31. - Vehicle not connected upon operator returning

The <u>trespass towing service</u> owner or operator of any towing service vehicle which is summoned to tow away any vehicle on private property, or stops to tow any vehicle under a valid "Roam Towing" provision on private property, shall not remove or tow the vehicle away and shall not charge any fee if the <u>registered owner or other legally authorized person in control of the</u> vehicle operator returns to the vehicle prior to the towing service operator having physically connected the vehicle to the towing apparatus, and moves the vehicle from the private property.

Sec. 14.5-32. - Vehicle not towed upon owner or other legally authorized person in control of the vehicle operator returning.

If the registered owner or other legally authorized person in control of the vehicle arrives at the scene prior to removal or towing of the vehicle, the vehicle shall be disconnected from the towing or removal apparatus, and that person shall be allowed to remove the vehicle without interference upon the payment of a reasonable service fee of not
