One of those was Vernell Brown Sr. who led Gainesville High School to a State Championship in football and starred in football at the University of Florida. One of her greatest loves was helping to coach young boys in Pop Warner Football; and

WHEREAS, a lover of people, a lover of life and a lover of her community, she is still remembered and revered by many as evidenced by the people who still approach her just to say thank you for being there for me, for teaching me about life and for letting me know and making me believe that I am and always will be somebody.
