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Subject: Outstanding News for Land Conservation in the City of Gainesville and Environs

Hello All!

Last night I returned from two days in Tallahassee, for the annual ranking of land acquisition projects by the Florida Communities Trust (FCT). FCT is funded by Florida Forever (previously Preservation 2000), a bond program of the State of Florida. These funds are restricted for use toward land conservation. Each year, Florida's cities, counties, and now, for the first time, non-profit land trusts compete for funding to buy land in their communities. In the past 10 years, of the program, funds have been received from FCT for only three projects in our area.

It is wonderful to share that the 85 projects selected to receive funding included the following six from our area:

255 acres - Blues Creek Ravine and Fox Pond - located between San Felasco State Preserve and residential neighborhoods to the east. The grant application was prepared and submitted by the Alachua Conservation Trust, in partnership with the Trust for Public Land, and presented by Pegeen Hanrahan of ACT, Senator Rod Smith and Beth Kostka of TPL. ACT has been working on this acquisition steadily for two years. The grant award was \$2.88 million toward the project.

477 acres - Little Hatchett Creek Flatwoods - located surrounding the Ironwood Golf Course in Northeast Gainesville, in the city's wellfield protection zone. The grant application was prepared and submitted by the City of Gainesville Nature Operations Division, and presented by Michelle Palmer of the City's Nature Operations Division. Primary supporters include Linda Dougan and family. The grant award was for \$1.17 million toward the project.

30 acres - Beville Creek - located on NW 8th Avenue just south of the Suburban Heights neighborhood, east of Kingswood. The grant application was prepared and submitted by the City of Gainesville. The grant award was for \$369,000 toward the project.

19 Acres - Sugarfoot Sink - located on the South side of Newberry Road, across from the new Millenium Bank building and points east to the old site of the Westside Baptist Church. The grant application was prepared and submitted by the City of Gainesville Nature Operations Division with enormous help from surrounding neighbors, and presented by Susan Wright, Senator Rod Smith and Pegeen Hanrahan. The grant award was for \$773,600 toward the project.

15.7 acres - Michanopy Native American Preserve - located in Historic Micanopy. The grant application was prepared and submitted by the Town of Micanopy, and presented by Town Councilman Joe Aufmuth. The grant award was for \$507,000.

The following additional projects were funded in our area:

2.07 acres - Melrose Heritage Park. The grant application was prepared and submitted by Putnam County, with the great assistance of a neighborhood coalition including Al Burt and Mark Barrow, and presented by Al Burt, another gentleman, and Senator Rod Smith. The grant award was for \$184,200 toward the project.

3.53 acres - Cedar Key Cemetary Pont Park. \$270,210 was received toward the project. The grant application was submitted by the City of Cedar Key (no other info available).

The grant application process is extremely lengthy and technical, and based partly on match provided by the applicant. I believe the City of Gainesville will continue to aggressively seek landowner discounts, private donations and partnerships with other government entitites to meet the required grant matches for its three partially funded projects. ACT will also continue to seek partnerships and donations for the Blues Creek Ravine project. If you would like to continue to help to make these conceptual projects a reality, please feel free to contact me.
