PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the passage of the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) extends federal civil rights protection in several areas to people who are considered "disabled;" and

WHEREAS, the ADA states its purpose as providing "a clear and comprehensive national mandate for the elimination of discrimination against individuals with disabilities;" and

WHEREAS, the ADA has five titles, which cover employment, public service and transportation, public accommodations, telecommunications, and miscellaneous provisions; and

WHEREAS, a person with a disability must be able to perform the essential functions of a job or meet the essential eligibility requirements of the program or benefit, with or without an accommodation to the person's condition; and

WHEREAS, July 26, 2000 marks the 10th Anniversary of the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act and we encourage all citizens to become more familiar with this important piece of civil rights legislation and to challenge outdated perceptions and beliefs about disabilities; and

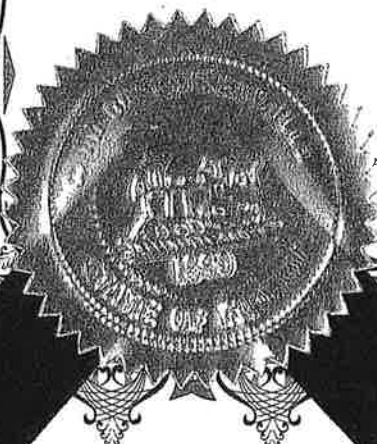
WHEREAS, on this day the City reaffirms its commitment to ensuring that all of its services, programs and activities are accessible to all qualified persons.
