

2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant

The Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) is a Federally funded program open to all local law enforcement agencies meeting certain minimum criteria based on the jurisdiction's Uniform Crime Report (UCR) statistics for the most recent three years. Though there is latitude in the projects allowed to be funded, each expenditure must be within seven specific Program Purpose Areas outlined by the U. S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance. The LLEBG requires a 10% local cash match. This year's application process is open until July 25th with funds being made available in October 2001.

Field Automation Project

This project will allow deployment of mobile data terminals and the purchase of necessary support hardware and software to make an operational system.
