WHEREAS, for 92 years, the NAACP, through political pressure, marches, demonstrations and effective lobbying, has served as the voice, as well as the shield of minority Americans; and

WHEREAS, today, after years of unrelenting struggle, the NAACP reaffirms its commitment to the true American Dream of an integrated society rich in diversity and open equality for all.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas D. Bussing, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim December 1, 2001 as

NAACP DAY

in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me in participating in activities supporting this effort and to join with us in celebrating the racial and cultural diversity of our community.
