Arthur J. Gallagher & Co. Insurance Brokerage & Risk Management Consulting

Services Update

The previous bid process, in which Arthur J. Gallagher & Co. (Gallagher) was selected as the broker, awarded the bid, and for which a contract was issued, is completed. Currently, underwriting is underway on property, casualty, and boiler & machinery insurance, with coverage anticipated to be placed and bound in the next two weeks. Gallagher has been directed to submit proposals for Worker's Compensation Excess Coverage, and PRIA will submit its proposal to the City for review. Upon submission, staff would review the proposals and recommend the best proposal.

Due to concerns regarding the present process, City staff has identified an insurance consultant, Waters Risk Management, that handles these processes for other municipalities and who is available to provide insurance consulting services. It is staff's intent to utilize the services of Waters Risk Management on the evaluation of the Worker's Compensation Excess Coverage carrier.

Various members of the City Commission have requested staff to seek an alternative to using Gallagher, since PRIA has indicated that they have the capacity to perform all of the placements. The City's contract with Gallagher became effective on July 21, 2005. A 45-day termination provision is included in the contract. The City Attorney has advised that should the City desire not to use Gallagher's services, a new brokerage firm selection bid process must be initiated. Due to the time line and the need to insure now, Waters Risk Management has advised that Gallagher be allowed to place the insurance, and if desired, negotiate a termination with the company to insure that follow-up services are handled properly. Bringing in a new broker may have additional associated costs.

Another option that has been suggested regarding insurance placement, which is to request that Gallagher agree to let other vendors go to market on all of the property and casualty products, and then to select the products that offer the best price, terms, and conditions. Staff has discussed this option with Gallagher, and Gallagher has agreed to this concept, if the City Commission so desires to move forward in this direction. Again, this may be an extended and more costly process. The City Attorney has not rendered an opinion on whether this is possible.

Attached is information provided by Waters Risk Management outlining a termination process (including new bid procedure) for moving coverage. Should the City Commission desire to move in this direction, such direction needs to be provided at the August 8, 2005 City Commission meeting, since there is an aggressive schedule associated with this concept. Staff would use the services of Waters Risk Management to assist the City in this process. It is anticipated that a new brokerage firm could be selected on or about October 1, 2005, and that all immediate coverages placed, with midterm insurance product renewals, or new coverages, handled by the new broker during the upcoming fiscal year.

Subj: Gallagher Options

Per your request, I spoke to Al Waters of Waters Risk Management to discuss the viable options concerning the timing of the City of Gainesville's insurance program placement and the ability to conduct a new broker selection process.

We discussed a timeline that would, at best, generate a completion of the process in late September. This would likely impact the City's ability to bind its coverages prior to the selection of the new broker and the issuance of Agent of Record letters. It is important that the City bind coverage as early as possible to avoid the impact of unforeseen events, such as hurricanes. He was also concerned about what might slip through the cracks given the narrow window of time available. Mr. Waters believes the City should continue to engage Gallagher through the renewal and placement of the City's insurance program and begin negotiating a termination agreement that would terminate Gallagher's services on or about October 1, 2005.

In addition, the City can begin a new selection process utilizing Mr. Waters's services that can ensure the selection of a broker can be achieved by October 1, 2005. The successful vendor would begin servicing our insurance program that is in place on October 1, 2005 and will be responsible for all mid-year insurance placements that would occur. Mr. Waters suggested that the City include a cost to service the existing program and costs associated with subsequent years insurance program renewal and placement. The first term should be a minimum of three years.

Mr. Waters's role would be to develop a Request for Proposal or Request for Qualifications and to help market the proposals to ensure greater participation in the process from the available vendors. He and his firm would qualify the vendors and would work with staff on the interview and selection process. Upon the completion of the process, the recommendation would be given to the City Commission for their approval.

Resolicitation of Agent Services Through RFQ Process

This is to follow up on a telephone conversation today in which we discussed our proposal to do an RFQ process for agent services and an RFP for workers compensation excess insurance coverage, prior to the October 1 renewal of the City of Gainesville's property/casualty insurance program.

Although our proposal was based on our recent conversation about acting as promptly as possible to replace Gallagher, possibly by early to mid-September, with an agent of record to a new insurance agent, our conversation of today led us to believe that it might be a better alternative to have Gallagher's services continue through September 30 to assure that full attention is provided to renewing the current program, rather than to get someone else involved for part of the renewal.

Accordingly, we suggested the following:

- 1. Determine on August 8 if it is the City Commission's desire to immediately perform another agent selection process, with an October 1 effective date.
- 2. If so, contact Gallagher and negotiate appropriate terms and fees for their activity through September 30 prior to the possibility of a new agent taking over with an agent of record letter effective October 1.
- 3. Consider if it is desirable to allow Gallagher to compete again, along with others who may be interested (including agents who did not compete in the previous RFQ) for an October 1 effective date of their service.
- 4. Assure that Gallagher is agreeable to the results, whatever they turn out to be, and will fully cooperate with the agent of record directive, and that they will help with a reasonable transition if they are not successful in maintaining the account for the period of October 1, 2005-2006.
- 5. Negotiate a reasonable fee with Gallagher for their services through September 30.
- 6. Assure that the City meets the 45 day notification required to Gallagher, e.g. provide notification August 14 or earlier.
- 7. Abandon a new RFP for workers compensation excess insurance. Stay committed to obtaining a proposal from PRIA/PGIT.
