PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, July 26, 2006 marks the 16th anniversary of the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); and

WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act states as its purpose to provide "a clear and comprehensive national mandate for the elimination of discrimination against individuals with disabilities"; and

WHEREAS. City policy prohibits discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation, and credit against persons because of a disability; and

WHEREAS, we encourage all citizens of Gainesville to become more familiar with this important piece of civil rights legislation and to challenge perceptions and beliefs about disabilities; and

WHEREAS, we encourage both private and public sector organizations conducting business within the city limits of Gainesville to become aware of and make a committment to carrying out the mandates of the Americans with Disabilities Act; and

WHEREAS, on this day the City affirms its commitment to ensuring that all of its services, programs and activities are accessible to all qualified persons.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Pegeen Hanrahan, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim July 2006 as

The Americans with Disabilities Act Awareness Month

in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me in dedicating ourselves toward fulfilling the intent and spirit of this law.
