Good Evening Madam Mayor and Commissioners,

My name is Marilyn Walker. I am representing the Citizens to Reform Industrial Zoning.

We believe that a Moratorium on I-2 industrial developments is reasonable, both to review the currently allowed heavy industrial (I-2) zoning uses, and to determine appropriate minimum distances between I-2 districts a residential neighborhoods, schools, parks, and environmentally sensitive areas.

Six of the seven currently zones I-2 areas are near residential areas, schools and parks. We are concerned that the range of uses currently allowed welfare of the citizens near these areas and, indeed, to all citizens of Gainesville.

This is not just rhetoric. According to C-span this morning Florida is the  $4^{\rm th}$  most polluting state out of 50 and we have recently learned that the Environmental Defense League, using data from the EPA, ranks Alachua county  $15^{\rm th}$  in terms of air quality in a system where 1st is the worst ranking.

We appreciate that enacting a moratorium is a difficult and complex matter in which many considerations must be balanced. We applaud the concern already shown by this commission in undertaking this difficult task. We strongly urge you to vote in favor of the metion the floor. Thank you.




## POLLUTION LOCATOR | Hazardous Air Pollutants | By County
