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UNINSURANCE RATES

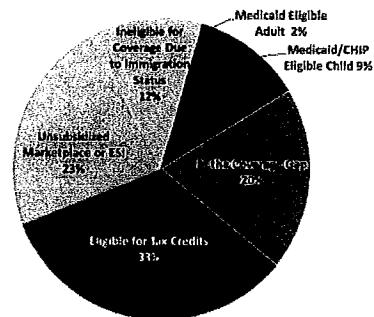
- Florida had 24.3% of population 0-64 uninsured in 2013
  - Second highest in the US at the time
- Medicaid in Florida (residents participating in at least one program)
  - October 2013: 3,290,371
  - March 2015: 3,724,245
- ACA Year One: 1.6 million Floridians signed up for insurance through the Marketplace
- Alachua County rates for uninsured adults under 65 have decreased from 30% in 2011 to 20% in 2015
- Medicaid in Alachua (residents participating in at least one program)
  - October 2013: 34,456
  - March 2015: 38,947

COVERAGE GAP

- About 20% of uninsured Floridians fall into "coverage gap"
  - Make too much for Medicaid without expansion, but not enough for benefits under the ACA
  - Majority of these individuals in Alachua are former CHOICES clients
- These individuals won't get fined under the ACA, but will not be able to afford quality health coverage without Medicaid expansion
- June 30, 2015: Low Income Pool (LIP) funding set to decrease from \$2.2B in hospital compensation for treating uninsured, under-insured and Medicaid patients
  - Hospitals will get less reimbursement for treating those in the coverage gap
