Dear City Plan Board Chair & Members,

As part of a 1999 settlement agreement with Alachua County, the Suwannee River Management District and the Florida Department of Environmental Regulation, the Petitioner was required to permanently set aside a 90-acre wetland area located within the Blues Creek neighborhood. The stipulations were clear – other than minor recreational structures (trails, gazebos, etc), development of any kind (houses, roads, utility lines) was strictly prohibited within the conservation area.

The Petitioner received substantial benefits as part of this agreement. He was excused from constructing five water control structures, associated infrastructure and perpetual maintenance of those structures. He was allowed to develop under a General Permit, as opposed to an Individual Permit, which significantly reduced time and expense of development. He was freed from threat of future lawsuits by the Conservation Planning Coalition provided that all actions taken by the developer were consistent with the permits.

This legality of this agreement was confirmed in 2013 after the Petitioner sued the City of Gainesville regarding his "right" to install of a wastewater line through the conservation area. He lost.

As part of his new application, the Petitioner is, once again, requesting to install utilities, including wastewater pipes, through the conservation area. This request is in clear violation of his development agreement.

The water from this site flows through Blues Creek Ravine Preserve to Big Otter Ravine in San Felasco State Park, a Floridan aquifer recharge site. Any contamination of this water could have serious consequences for our area's drinking water.

The Suwannee St. Johns Sierra Club is requesting the City Plan Board to recommend the removal of the Petitioner's request to install utilities through the Blues Creek conservation area.
