#### Project Title

- 1. Citizen Board member professional development. Board members are encouraged to attend the Florida Recreation & Parks Associate Conference sessions relating to citizen's volunteer boards. Priority for funding, if available, should be given to new members and members who consistently attend Board meetings. Expected benefits: Attendees will bring back useful information and present it to other Board members. Attendees will have renewed enthusiasm and motivation.
- 2. Annual planning retreat and workplan development. Each year the Board will engage in a special planning meeting to review the current workplan and draft the following year workplan. Annually the Board will review the City's Comprehensive Plan and the Department's Capital Improvement Projects. Expected benefits: Improves adherence to workplan; improves advice to City Commission.
- 3. Albert "Ray" Massey Citizen Volunteer Award. Continue this award program to recognize community members who make extraordinary contributions to recreation. Increase advertising to solicit more nominees. Expected benefits: Reward outstanding community volunteers. Publicize parks and recreational programs and the benefits of volunteering. Encourage a greater sense of volunteerism in the community.
- 4. Participate in dedication and promotion of new parks and recreation facilities. The Board will attend scheduled events and ceremonies. Expected benefits: Increased community awareness of the Board's involvement in and commitment to recreation and park facilities.
- 5. Capital Improvement Projects (CIP). The Board will support staff's efforts to prioritize, fund and implement CIP by periodic review of projects, attendance at community meetings, and other activities as requested. Expected benefits: Increased awareness of community needs. Improved advice to the City Commission.

**Fours and presentations.** The Board will tour selected City parks and recreation facilities no less than twice a year, and will continue to receive regular presentations from staff. Expected benefits: Improved knowledge and understanding of related issues; improved advice to Department and City Commission.

- 7. Naming of parks and facilities. The Board, in concert with the Nature Centers Commission when appropriate, will continue to recommend approval for names of parks, recreation areas, facilities and centers in accordance with the City of Gainesville Policy for Naming City Parks.
- 8. Citizen input. Assist the Department in obtaining and analyzing feedback from the public about its facilities and programs.
- 9. City Commission input. Invite the members of the Standing Committee on Recreation, Cultural Affairs & Public Works to meet with the Board at a regularly scheduled meeting annually.
- 10. **Program collaboration.** Continue to investigate ways to assist the Department in exploring collaborative methods with other recreation providers through discussion and recommendation.
- 11. Performance indicators. Annually review the Department performance indicators.
