

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN ALACHUA COUNTY AND  
CITY OF GAINESVILLE for  
EMERGENCY SHELTER SERVICES**

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT is made and entered into this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2011, by and between Alachua County, a charter county and political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "County", and the City of Gainesville, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City".

**WITNESSETH:**

**WHEREAS**, the parties previously entered into an Interlocal Agreement dated March 1, 2010 for the provision of emergency shelter services, as amended on June 7, 2010 to clarify the effective date; and


**WHEREAS**, the \$50,000 funding provided for FY 2010-2011 has been depleted early due to the consistent cold weather and the two agencies funded have requested the City and County approve additional funds so that services can be provided through March 31, 2011; and

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the parties mutually agree to amend the Agreement as follows:


The County and the City shall each contribute an additional \$30,000 (the "Additional Funding") to fund services during FY2010-2011. Accordingly, the maximum reimbursement the City may request from the County for FY2010-2011 is increased to \$55,000; provided the City has expended (not just encumbered) an equal amount of funds.

This Second Amendment shall take effect upon the date of execution by the parties. SAVE and EXCEPT as expressly amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the Interlocal Agreement dated March 1, 2010, as amended on June 7, 2010, between the parties, shall be and remain in full force and effect.






