5	<u>(1)</u>	The nuisance abatement board of the city is hereby created to serve as a quasi-judicial
6	s 5: II	forum in which controversies over the existence of public nuisances may be resolved in
7		the public interest with due process of law. This board shall consist of seven five
8	8	persons. Members of the Gainesville code enforcement board city commission shall
9		serve ex officio as members of the nuisance abatement board.
10	(2)	Members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for such travel,
11		mileage and per diem expenses as may be authorized by the city attorney.

14	(1)	The members of the board shall elect a chair who shall be a voting member from among
15		the members of the board. The member elected chair shall serve as chair for a term of
16		one year and may be re-elected to serve an additional term or terms as chair.
17	(2)	The presence of four three members shall constitute a quorum of the board. The
18		affirmative vote of at least three members shall be necessary to take action.
19	(3)	The board is authorized to establish its own rules of procedure, subject to approval by the
20		city commission.
21	<u>(4)</u>	The chair of the board may call hearings of the board. Hearings may also be called by
22		written notice signed by at least three members of the board. The clerk of the board may

15	<u>(a)</u>	The city attorney is authorized to initiate proceedings in the circuit court for willful disobedience
16		or failure to comply with any order of the board.
17	<u>(b)</u>	Further, the city attorney is authorized to initiate proceedings in any county, state or federal
18		forum for the suspension or revocation of any permits, licenses, concessions or contracts held or
19		awarded to the violator including contracts awarded under § 24.112, Fla. Stat., (lottery retailers)
20		and including licenses for the sale of beverages issued under §561.19, Fla. Stat., where the
21		existence of such permits licenses, concessions or contracts is conducive to the maintenance of
22		such nuisance.
