4. How has the community's input/feedback been incorporated into the recommendations being presented to the City Commission?

Comments and input received at each event were incorporated into the plans for the park. The Wild Spaces & Public Places (WSPP) Program and the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs (PRCA) Department held two open houses in 2017, a neighborhood workshop in 2018, and conducted an online survey to gather public input and to discuss the proposed redevelopment of Northside Park. Meetings were also held with the Chain Hawks (the local disc golf club), the Racquetball Club of Gainesville, and Gainesville Petanque, as well as other key stakeholder groups to ensure that the proposed park improvements will support all user groups.
