19 arrests made in Chiefland drug bust

CHIEFLAND — Police picked up 19 people, six cars and \$1,307 in cash over the weekend as part of Operation Round Up, an undercover drug investigation that started several months ago. Those arrested ranged in age from 18 to 53 and included men and women as well as people who were white, black and Hispanic. The charges were for buying and selling marijuana or crack cocaine to undercover agents over the past several months. Some of the sales were within 1,000 feet of a school and could result in harsher sentences.

The operation targeted the southern end of Chiefland and was a joint effort by police, the Levy County Sheriff's Office and the Ocala/Marion County Drug Task Force. The area involved was a place that police Chief Robert Douglas and Sheriff Jimmy Smith said has been known for drug problems for years.

None of those arrested had any guns on them, but some were carrying drugs, such as marijuana pre-packaged in the joint-sized plastic bags and a pill bottle filled with crack cocaine.

"These guys are mainly out there for a quick buck for they are street-level dealers," Douglas said.

"We have other cases of greater magnitude and some people still to be arrested in this case," Smith said.

The chief and sheriff did not want to release much information about whether the street-level dealers would be questioned about their suppliers, but did indicate the investigation was ongoing.

"There are some bigger fish to fry," Douglas said. "And our lines are baited and in the water," Smith said.

of operations. But while the commission promised to act if MV does not improve, some residents said they wished the contract would not have been renewed at all.

"We've heard this over and over and we're tired of it," said Marlon Jackson, a blind woman who relies on MV.

Problems have plagued Gainesville's paratransit service for years, problems some hoped would be solved when the city contracted with MV in 2003. MV replaced a group of three local companies that had provided the service previously and which drew similar criticisms.

Since then, residents say they have continued to experience problems with the service. Commissioners have previously heard these complaints and received promises from MV that service would improve.

"This is a persistent problem and I think we've followed the same process since we've had MV on as our provider and nothing's changed," Commissioner Ed Bradley said. "Even though we've got things right have not changed."

A report that will be presented to commissioners late this week recommends the city take over all or part of the paratransit system to improve service. Public Works Director Teresa Scott told the commission. But some commissioners said this could cause its own problems.

"I am very conscious that this is a tough service to provide well and I am also very conscious that the city would probably be unable to provide it at a lower cost," Mayor Peggen Hanrahan said. "To me the best possible outcome would be that MV finally bring us the service that they said they would."

in which he beat another man with brass knuckles, according to Duval County court records.

No one said they recalled the charges, though one man said he remembered reading that the three men charged in the incident were "always in trouble."

Chippierfeld also asked potential jurors what specifically they remembered seeing on television news reports about the incident. Many said they saw footage of a surveillance video from the CSX building showing more than one man punching or kicking Brown. He also asked several people if they had connections to UF, and if they had attended the Florida-Georgia football game last year.

Chippierfeld moved to strike the panel of jurors after one man said that during the lunch break, he overheard another

potential juror saying he'd already decided Lane was guilty.

Schemer denied the motion, but asked each juror if he or she had heard anyone talking about the facts of the case. Chippierfeld asked the jurors where they went to lunch, how they got there and what they heard on the way.

The juror who talked about the case over lunch was identified and dismissed. He told Schemer and the attorneys that the other jurors who heard him didn't react to his statement.

Ten people were dismissed by the end of the day. Jury selection continues today, with attorneys questioning the potential jurors as a group. Opening statements could start as early as this afternoon.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO IMPLEMENT EXCLUSIVE COMMERCIAL FRANCHISES

The City of Gainesville, Florida, City Commission hereby provides notice pursuant to Section 403.70605, Florida Statutes, of its intent to consider whether to authorize one or more exclusive franchises for the provision of solid waste services to commercial property within the City of Gainesville. Currently, the City does not have an exclusive franchise for such services. Instead, the City has non-exclusive franchises with numerous commercial solid waste service providers. In the event the City determines to implement one or more exclusive commercial franchises within the City Limits, the exclusive franchise would take effect no sooner than October 10, 2009.

The City Commission will consider the adoption of a resolution electing to implement one or more exclusive commercial franchises as authorized by Section 403.70605, Florida Statutes, at a public hearing to be held in the City Commission Chambers, City Hall, 200 East University Avenue, Gainesville, Florida 32601, on Monday, the 9th day of October, A.D., 2006, at 6:00 o'clock p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard.

All persons are advised that, if they decide to contest any decision made at this public hearing, they will need a record of the proceedings and, for such purpose, they may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. All interested persons are invited to attend and be heard.
