Public Schools Facilities Element



- Issue 3: Encourage Livable Neighborhoods for People of All Ages
- Policy 3.1.2 Encourage use of existing schools as neighborhood centers. Delete term "existing".

- Obj. 2.6 & Policy 2.6.1 re: annual adoption of School Board's annually updated 5-Year District Facilities Work Program in our CIE
 - Revise to incorporate Work Program by reference

Potable Water & Wastewater Element



Issue 8: Strengthen Natural Resource Protection

- New policies needed to:
- address water supply level of service (LOS) requirements
- state alternative water supply projects will be adopted w/in 18 months of water mgt. district adoption
- Add additional water conservation policies



Key Findings for Water/Wastewater Element

- City has substantially met the goals, objectives & policies
- Element needs new policies concerning water supply, water conservation, and water mgt. district water supply plans
- Potable water LOS revisions needed based on updated data & analysis



Recommended Changes – Potable Water/Wastewater Element

- Adopt water supply LOS
- Update potable water treatment plant capacity LOS based on data & analysis
- Amend existing water conservation policies and add new policies
- Add policy concerning adoption of water mgt. district water supply plans
- Delete unneeded policies

EAR Assessment: Solid Waste Element



Issue 2: Reduction of Greenhouse Gases

 Objective 1.1 - Recommend change from 50% to 75% waste diversion target of State



Key Findings for Solid Waste Element

- Substantially met Goals, Objectives & Policies
- 100-megawatt Biomass facility approved by PSC
- Solid Waste Transfer station is receiving insufficient tonnage
- Weak enforcement provisions for nonparticipation in comm'l recycling program



Recommended Changes

- Objective 1.1 increase waste diversion target rate to 75%
- Add policy re: collection of food waste from restaurants & institutions for composting & production of methane gas
- Policy 1.1.5 Increase recycling participation from 60% to 98% of MF Residential & Commercial properties
- Date & name changes

EAR Assessment:Housing Element



Issue 1: Clarify Activity Center, Mixeduse, Urban Design Req'ts

 AHAC - New policies needed re: affordable housing incentives near transp. hubs, major employment centers, and mixed use development



Issue 2: Greenhouse Gas Reduction

- AHAC rec'd encouraging energy efficiency upgrades to rental units; new policies needed
- Add policies re: energy efficiency standards in design/construction of new housing & encouraging renewable energy use



Issue 3: Livable Neighborhoods for People of All Ages

- AHAC add policy under Obj 1.2 to study allowance of accessory residential units (ADUs) in res'l zoning districts, especially in single-family neighborhoods in University Context Area
- Plan Board allow ADUs



Issue 6: Infill & Redevelopment

- Delete Policy 3.5.1 (contemplated owner occupancy incentive program City/UF never budgeted by UF)
- Revise Policy 3.5.2 to indicate City shall continue to implement recommendations on increasing desirability of owneroccupancy in Univ. Context Area;



Issue 7: Navigate the New Economy

Policy 3.1.9 - revise to add "very lowincome and extremely low income areas" to this economic development assistance policy for low-income areas



Key Findings for Housing Element

- Goals, Objectives & Policies substantially met
- 2006 2010: homeless pop. in County averaged approx. 1,280
- One-stop Center going forward



Key Findings for Housing Element

- Cedar Grove II completed in 2006 with 131 single-family homes
- 3 subsidized housing develop'ts
 (Kennedy Homes '03, Seminary Lane '09, Glen Springs Manor '09) closed during planning period



Key Findings for Housing Element

- GRU's Low-income Energy Efficiency Program (LEEP) weatherized 262 homes prior to FY 2010; Federal & local funding for 276 homes for FY 2010
- Porter's Garden (SW 3rd Street & Depot Ave): 5 new single-family homes for firsttime homebuyers
