2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending Section 30-66 Central city district (CCD) of the Land Development Code; by adding research and development in the physical, engineering and life sciences to the list of permitted uses by right; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.
10	WHEREAS, publication of notice of a public hearing was given that the text of the Land
11	Development Code of the City of Gainesville, Florida, be amended; and
12	WHEREAS, notice was given and publication made as required by law and a public
13	hearing was then held by the City Plan Board on February 23, 2012; and
14	WHEREAS, pursuant to law, an advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10
15	inches long was placed in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of the public
16	hearing to be held in the City Commission Meeting Room, First Floor, City Hall, in the City of
17	Gainesville at least seven (7) days after the first advertisement was published; and
18	WHEREAS, a second advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10 inches long
19	was placed in the aforesaid newspaper notifying the public of the second public hearing to be
20	held at least five (5) days after the day the second advertisement was published; and
21	WHEREAS, public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices described above
22	at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,
23	heard.
24	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
25	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
26	Section 1. Subsection (c) of Section 30-66 of the Land Development Code is amended as

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1 follows. Except as amended herein, the remainder of Section 30-66 remains in full force and

2 effect.

## 3 Sec. 30-66 – Central city district (CCD).

4 (a) *Purpose*. The central city district is established to provide a means to improve the physical, economic, social and cultural character of downtown Gainesville. The ultimate goal of the 5 6 district is to maintain the downtown as a focal point of the community and a setting for people to 7 live, work, shop and be entertained without leaving the district. This goal will be accomplished 8 by allowing commercial services, professional, administrative, governmental and community 9 services, financial services, entertainment and cultural activities, and medium to high density housing, as individual or mixed land uses, and by providing design standards and guidelines 10 11 intended to preserve and enhance the downtown's distinctive physical attributes as mandated by 12 the city comprehensive plan.

13 (b) Objectives.

14 (1) Promote the central city district as a focal point of the community by providing for a
 15 variety of office, business, public and cultural activities;

16 (2) Provide for the development of housing at urban densities

17 (3) Provide for cafes and for the conduct of concerts, festivals and other specified18 activities outside of enclosed buildings;

- 19 (4) Promote the integration of pedestrian traffic with vehicular traffic;
- 20 (5) Encourage the use of design standards and guidelines to promote development and
   21 redevelopment which is sensitive to architectural resources, preserves visual quality,
   22 enhances visual unity and accommodates pedestrians; and
- 23 (6) Encourage a continuous urban facade along streets, sidewalks and pedestrian ways to
   24 maintain a strong urban character.

If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this Ordinance 7 or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such 8 finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given 9 effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the 10 provisions of this Ordinance are declared severable.

- 11 Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of
- 12 such conflict hereby repealed.
