PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Since the 1940's the Gainesville Academy of Electrical Technology (GAET), a not-for-profit school, has been training and equipping men and women to be licensed electricians with a journeyman's accreditation; and

WHEREAS, GAET is the result of a partnership between labor (IBEW, Jocal 1205) and Management (NECA, North Florida chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association) which joined to support the training and licensing of electricians in Gainesville and surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of a 5-year course of study, classroom and on-the-job training, graduates receive the journeyman's credential and a license which affords them a higher pay scale; and

WHEREAS, through a partnership with the Florida Solar Energy Center, GAET has developed a leading solar energy project and has added solar energy to its electrical curriculum; and

WHEREAS, During Earth Week, April 19, 2005, GAET celebrates its solar project and training center with a presentation and dedication at 2420 NE 17th Terrace, Gainesville, Florida at 10:30 A.M.
