Headline: 1) Partnership as an asset; 2) Entrepreneurship and Startups (broadband, affordable); 3) Rising everyone up; 4) Erasing economic disparities (now - forward thinking); and 5) As a model city.

Bottom Line: 1) Everyone has access to internet; 2) Median household income for all (different ethnicities, genders) is same every year gap narrows; and 3) Every government institution pays a living wage.
