PACE CENTER POR GIRLS, INC.

FIRST: The name of this corporation is:

PACE CENTER FOR GIRLS, INC.

SECOND: This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational and other non-profitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law). Pace Center for Girls, Inc. is a non-profit, non-residential, community-based program established to educate, rehabilitate, and otherwise serve female juvenile offenders between the ages of 14 and 18 in Duval County, Florida, and surrounding counties. To promote this primary purpose, the corporation's objectives shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (a) To develop a state-accredited junior high and high school education program for female juvenile offenders referred to the Center, and thereby to educate and to assist and promote those female juvenile offenders in obtaining a state-accredited high school education;
- (b) To provide female juvenile offenders upon graduation from the program with the necessary skills to become independent, self-reliant, and self-supporting individuals;
- (c) To insure that court orders issued relating to female juvenile offenders in the program are complied with, and to minimize recidivism;
- (d) To preserve and strengthen personal growth of female juvenile offenders in the program, and to strengthen family ties;
 - (e) To provide individual, group, and family counseling;
- (f) To develop individual treatment plans to assist the needs and meet the objectives of each female juvanile offender in the program;

- (3) To provide follow-up services for each female juvenile offender for a period of three years after greduction 21 from the program;
- (h) To promote the prevention of cruelty to f∈male juvenile offenders;
- (i) To involve female juvenile offenders in community service projects;
- (j) To assist in locating employment for female juvenile offenders upon graduation from the program;
- (k) To develop a scholarship fund and a job placement program to insure educational and employment opportunities for graduates of the program.

The corporation shall be empowered and authorized to do any and all things which corporations not-for-profit are authorized to do under the laws of the State of Florida; provided, however, that the corporation shall not carry on activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law). No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and disbursements in furtherance of the purposes hereinbefore set forth in this Article Second.

THIRD: This corporation shall have perpetual existence.

provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law), as the Foard of Direction chall determine. This letter is in response to your request of February 3, regarding your organization's tax exempt status.

In November 1985, we issued a letter that recognized your organization as exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information submitted with the application, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(il). That classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's purposes, character, method of operations, or sources of support have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the organization's exempt status and foundation status.

Revenue Procedure 75-50, published in Cumulative Bulletin 1975-2 on page 587, sets forth guidelines and record keeping requirements for determining whether private schools have racially nondiscriminatory policies as to students. Your organization must comply with this revenue procedure to maintain its tax-exempt status.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, they are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Your organization is not required to file federal income tax returns unless it is subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If your organization is subject to this tax, it must file an income tax return on the Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your organization's present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

The law requires you to make your organization's annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. If your organization had a copy of its application for recognition of exemption on July 15, 1987, it is also required to make available for public inspection a copy of the exemption application, any supporting documents and the exemption letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You can charge only a reasonable fee for reproduction and actual postage costs for the copied materials. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (World Wide Web). You may be liable for a penalty of \$20 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection (up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return).

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your organization's exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it with the organization's permanent records.

Project Narrative Community Contribution Tax Credit Program PACE Center for Girls of Alachua

PACE Center for Girls of Alachua is currently holding a Capital Campaign to raise money for expansion of its current facility.

The PACE Alachua Center moved into it's current location in December of 1998 with 30 girls and 9 staff members. Today the Center serves approximately 40 girls with 13 staff and has outgrown the space. One teacher has no classroom and "floats" from class to class during the planning period of other teachers. Two program aides share desks in the Xerox and computer rooms. Both of these positions require numerous phone calls for attendance and follow-up on the girls, which is difficult in a rather public, noisy space. Three counseling interns from the University of Florida share a space the size of a large closet. When resource people from the community come to help the girls (probation officers, people from Corner Drug Store, Planned Parenthood, tutors from the University of Florida, etc.), there is often no unused space for them to meet. We have storage up to the ceilings in the staff bathroom and our file room, as well as storage units in the main hallways. We currently have no room large enough to comfortably accommodate our family functions. This project will greatly relieve this situation.

The Campaign project is taking place in three stages. First, we will buy the current building from our landlord. Second we will build a seven classroom addition located behind the current building. Third, we plan to renovate the current building to administrative and counseling offices, a library and a large multi-purpose room.

Current square footage of the PACE Center is approximately 4700 square feet. Addition of seven classrooms (with a covered walkway connecting the two separate buildings) would add 4367 square feet.

PACE has a great deal of community support for this project. Susan and Tom Spain, owners of Spain/Cooper Construction, are orchestrating the planning and design of the addition and have offered to build it at cost. Susan has enlisted the help of the Builder's Association of North Central Florida, who have agreed to take PACE on as a project for two years. Susan has itemized the materials, resources and labor needed to complete Phase II of the project and what the value of each contribution is worth. Members of the association have signed up to contribute specific items on her list. The Homebuilders are also contributing by buying "Building Blocks for PACE" for \$50/apiece.

PACE Alachua was also voted to be the recipient of the Rotary Club's Wild Game Feast proceeds this year. This event was held in March. The final amount of the earnings has not been tabulated, but is expected to be at least \$75,000.

The campaign has received two donations from community members of \$50,000 each. A local couple, Rick and Aase Thompson, recently hosted a cocktail party at their home which netted several more thousand dollars as well as the promise of more contributions in the near future.

Although this is an excellent beginning, more financial resources as well as materials will be sought to bring the project to completion.

The new classroom building has been creatively designed to insure a low cost per square foot while employing techniques that will insure future savings in energy and maintenance, i.e. a straight gable roof, concrete block, with individual high-efficiency HVAC and state of the art insulation. When the project is complete, PACE will have constructed a cost and energy efficient building which will allow us to realize our program's potential in ways we are unable to presently within the limits of our current space.

Estimates of the total project cost are \$1,000,000. This includes \$400,000 to build the seven classrooms, \$100,000 to remodel the current facility and \$500,000 to pay off the mortgage.

We hope to begin building in July 2009 and look for completion by September 2010. The project will take longer to complete because we are getting so much donated and we will have to work around the builder's schedules.


