Kidnapping suspect's girlfriend knew of plans

Officials say she helped her boyfriend write the ransom notes.

BRANDSTON — Ane Purcoo, 21, begged her boyfriend to release the 15-year-old boy, kidnapped or gangster from a bus stop in Parrish, authorities said in court papers released Thursday.

Talking to her by cell phone the day of the kidnapping, Victor Beltran-Moreno promised he would go back that evening to check on the boy, Choy Moner, whom he had left tied to a tree, Manatee County sheriff's deputies said in the reports.

The boy escaped and reported the kidnappers to the Sheriff's Office. Beltran-Moreno surrendered in March, 12 days after the boy's kidnapping that drew national attention.

The wife, spokeswoman, decided to press charges of accessory after the fact against Purcoo, 21, who had been under investigation since the crime. The authorities say Purcoo begged Beltran-Moreno, 21, evade authorities after his kidnapping. She had multiple opportunities, detectives say, to call 911 to

report the crime.

Purcoo was arrested Wednesday and was expected to be released from jail Thursday on \$10,000 bail, her attorney said.

Weeks before the kidnapping, detectives say, Beltran-Moreno instructed Purcoo to write ransom notes that were supposed to be part of the abduction. A Mexican national who was in the U.S. illegally, Beltran-Moreno cannot visit England.

Purcoo wrote several drafts, authorities say. Purcoo also drove Beltran-Moreno to a town in the Texas border where Beltran-Moreno stepped into Mexico, authorities conveyed. Beltran-Moreno surrendered in Texas about a week after he fled the country.

The boy's attorney, Mark Lipnicki, said in court Thursday that without Purcoo's cooperation, Beltran-Moreno could not have remained in Alachua County. Beltran-Moreno is being held without bail in Manatee County on a charge of armed kidnapping. His trial is scheduled for early next year.

Calling it a great irony, Lipnicki said Purcoo could not have been charged with a crime in the case if she had been married to Beltran-Moreno. She was a passenger in a car that was not certain communication between husband and wife.

Officers rely on stop sticks during chases

DAYTONA BEACH — The driver of the fleeing vehicle had tried to run over a state park officer and was barreling toward Volusia County Sheriff's Deputy Richard Fortin.

Fortin grabbed the stop sticks from his patrol car and set them on the shoulder of a road in Holly Hill. Despite his numerous hours of training, Fortin could not help feeling tense as he crouched behind his patrol car for safety on the night of May 20. He listened to his radio as the dispatcher relayed the vehicle's description and direction. Then the vehicle came into view.

Fortin pulled the stop sticks onto the road and managed to hit three of the four tires," Fortin said. "You could hear a loud thumping as the air was forced out of the tires."

David Fivale, 32, of Daytona Beach did not get far. He was arrested and charged with aggravated assault on a law enforcement officer, fleeing and eluding and driving under the influence.

As police departments across the nation have learned live pursuit of fleeing vehicles is not the most dangerous situation, they've turned to stop sticks to reduce the potential of costly damages and injury to innocent bystanders.

Officers pursue at a distance, relying on information on the fleeing car to officers without up stop sticks where they believe the vehicle is heading. When they succeed, the sticks puncture the tires of the fleeing car, forcing them to gradually slow as pressure on the pursuing officer eases.

Stop sticks can be dangerous, and the strategy does not always work.

In July 2003, Flagler County Sheriff's Office Deputy Charles "Chuck" Sease, 35, was killed annually after being struck at 2:54 a.m. by a car driven by Bruce Harold Grove Jr., 38. Sease and another deputy were laying sticks on the northbound exit ramp from Interstate 95 to State Road 100 when Grove's car came into view as the deputy was running away from the ramp.

During a recent training session near Orlando, deputies using fake stop sticks understood the danger Fortin faced. The reason is natural because deploying stop sticks involves stopping a speeding vehicle, said Kathy Daniels, trainer and coordinator of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Emergency Vehicle Operations Center.

However, stop sticks can be dangerous, and the strategy does not always work.

Sheriff's deputies at Volusia and Flagler counties take extensive training, including deployment of dummy stop sticks every year, officials said.

In the training session, Daniels drove a white F150 pickup on a winding course as a marked patrol car followed. Just as the truck approached, Deputy Wayne Miller tossed the orange-colored plastic stop sticks.

While the truck merely ran over the plastic dummies, deployment of real stop sticks in actual chases does not always go as smoothly, Miller said.

"You have one officer already chasing a guy who does not want to be caught. You never know what that person is capable of doing to get away again," he said.

Situations change but during a chase, making it even more dangerous, said Deputy Jones. Some officers have to deal with motorists who pay little or no attention to flashing lights on the road and others who try to go around officers setting up the spiked strips, Nunn said.

"Somewhere by the time the information gets to you, there is not enough time to set up and you have to toss it into the road," Nunn said.

Tossing equipped the officer to the approaching speeding vehicle, Nunn said.

Daniels said the Sheriff's Office uses stop sticks two or three times a month.

But mistakes can occur. On Oct. 25, Seminole County Sheriff's Office deputies practiced the firing of two rats they thought were stolen in looking for a silver Mustang shortly before 2 a.m.

On Oct. 25, they threw stop sticks into the path of two unmarked vehicles, a Seminole County sheriff's report states.

And in Gainesville, state troopers punished the tires of a minivan on Oct. 18 only to find the driver was an undercover sheriff's investigator soliciting a fellow deputy, according to a Maxon, Fla., newspaper report.

Despite the errors and danger, Fortin believes stop sticks are the best way to stop speeding vehicles.

Training allowed some of the pursuing. Fortin said "I made a chase with the intent means of injury to a person or damage to property."

Details of bomb-making video by USF student emerge

TAMPA — Instead of carrying out "martyrdom" operations, people can use remote explosives and save themselves for the real battle, an Egyptian student said on a home-made video, according to federal prosecutors.

A court filing released earlier this week provided new details about the video, which is a key piece of evidence in the case against University of South Florida student Ahmed Abdelhadi Shams Mohamed, who faces federal espionage charges after his arrest in August.

Mohamed and fellow USF student Yousef Samir Khalil were pulled over by police for a traffic stop in Lenoir Creek, S.C., about 15 miles northwest of Charlotte and near a Navy weapons station. Officers found explosives in their car and a

laptop belonging to Mohamed that contained the video he made that demonstrates how to convert a remote-controlled car into a detonator for bombs, according to the FBI.

The men are in jail pending trial and have pleaded not guilty. Also on Mohamed's laptop — in a folder labeled "Bomb Stock" — were files about ingredients for explosive, according to the filing by Assistant United States

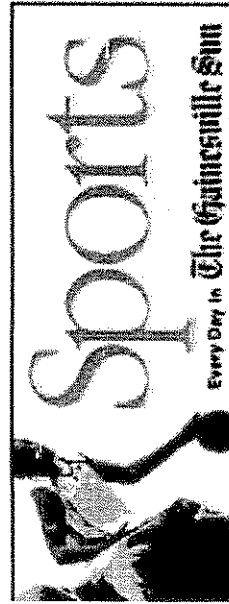
Attorney Jay Holler in Tampa. In addition, the laptop was used to upload the video onto YouTube, the filing said, and it contained a record of an e-mail sent to YouTube in July asking why the submitted video hadn't been posted on the Web site.

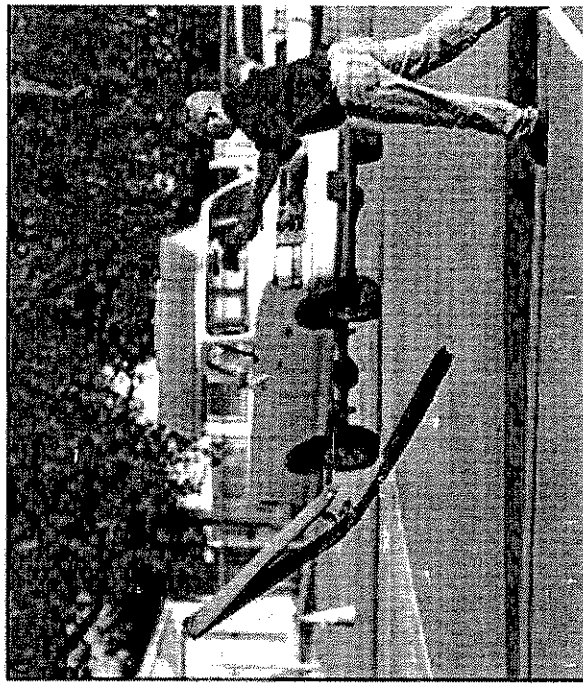

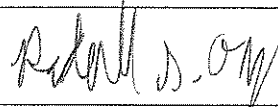
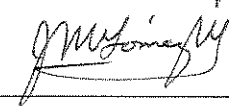
