- Nordstrom awarded an \$85,479 Quick Response Training Grant.
- Exactech, Inc. awarded a \$65,962 Quick Response Training grant.
- Since 1990, CEO-provided assistance to such companies as Naylor
   Publications, Florida Food Service, American Polysteel Forms, Heat Pipe
   Technology and others has resulted in more than \$242,069 in estimated yearly
   property taxes paid to the City of Gainesville.
- Companies located in the Airport Industrial Park alone have generated
   \$46,835,540 in capital investment.
- Approximately 670 jobs have been created or retained by companies in the Airport Industrial Park.
- More than \$1,971,534 in state road funds and training dollars have been captured for companies in the Airport Industrial Park.
- CEO staff participated in workshops on the Transportation Concurrency
   Exception Area and the Depot Avenue Redevelopment project.
- CEO in conjunction with the Alliance for Economic Development and the Gainesville Area Chamber of Commerce worked to attract better air service to the Gainesville Regional Airport.
- CEO promoted Gainesville's Enterprise Zone to numerous companies seeking a new location.






