MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

AS of 15 June 2009

- I. GRANT PARTICIPANTS:
 - a. The CITY OF GAINESVILLE
 - b. MV Transportation, Inc.
- II. Project:
 - a. Whereas the Regional Transit Service and contracted with MV Transportation on 15 Sept 09 to provide ADA paratransit service to the citizens of the City of Gainesville: and
 - b. Whereas the City of Gainesville is the recipient of a USC 5316 Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC) Grant awarded on June 5th 2009 which provides paratransit service for disadvantage citizens in need of access to places of employment beginning August 1st, 2009; and
 - c. Whereas a USC 5317 New Freedom grants is pending which, when awarded will provide service to ADA certified individuals who have a Gainesville address but live in the unincorporated areas surrounding the City of Gainesville, thus expanding the current service area; and
 - d. Whereas, MV Transportation is able to, and agrees to provide trips to the disadvantaged and disabled citizens of the City of Gainesville and Alachua County consistent with the requirements of the above listed grant programs.

THEREFORE, the parties agree to operate under the GRANTS as follows:

- III. MV Transportation shall:
 - a. Provide separate invoices for the individual grant programs to insure compliance with the grant requirements
 - b. Adhere to the same rules and requirements outlined in the current contract referenced in section II.a. above which rules and requirements also apply to the trips provided under these grant programs.
 - c. Charge a \$3.00 fare for each trip.
- IV. City of Gainesville shall:
 - a. Abide by the conditions of the current contract as reference in section II.a. above.
 - b. The invoices submitted for these grant programs will be reviewed monthly when submitted for payment by MV Transportation to ensure compliance with grant requirements.
