WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of		
general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a Public		
Hearing in the Auditorium of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and		
WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice described at		
which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in		
fact, heard;		
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE		
CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:		
Section 1. Section 5-1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is amended to		
read as follows:		
Sec. 5-1. Definitions.		
Fowl shall include roosters, other chickens when there are more than two, pea fowl, and		
like animals (Galliformes); ducks, geese, and like animals (Anseriformes); emus; rheas;		
and ostriches (Struthio camelus). A chicken that crows shall be considered a rooster.		
Section 2. Section 5-3 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:		
Sec. 5-3. Animals in residential areas.		
(a) No person shall keep or harbor any animal for use other than as a pet within any

residential district, as defined in section 30-41(a)(1) of this Code, or mixed-use district, as 1 defined in section 30-41(a)(4) of this Code, in the city, except if such use is allowed by 2 right or special use permit, or if such use existed as a legal non-conforming use on 3 October 23, 1995. 4 Subsection (a) notwithstanding, no No person shall keep or harbor any fowl or (b) 5 livestock within any residential district, as defined in section 30-41(a)(1) of this Code, or 6 mixed-use district, as defined in section 30-41(a)(4) of this Code, in the city, except if 7 such use is allowed by right or special use permit, or if such use existed as a legal non-8 conforming use on October 23, 1995. 9 Section 3. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 10 and 2 of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the 11 City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may 12 be renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions. 13 Section 4. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid 14 or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no 15 way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. 16 Section 5. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of 17 such conflict hereby repealed. 18 Section 6.
