City of Gainesville Priorities

- Pension Reform HB365 / SB910 (FLC Support)
 - Amends Chapter 175 & 185, F.S.
 - Cities and police/fire are to collectively bargain retirement benefits and the use of the insurance premium tax
 - Cities are authorized to unilaterally transition to another retirement program for police/fire and continue to receive insurance premium tax revenue
 - Police/fire pension boards are required to provide fiscal transparency and accountability
 - Police officers are allowed to use only up to 300 hours per year in overtime compensation when calculating retirement benefits



City of Gainesville Priorities

- University Concurrency Board of Governors proposal to repeal university concurrency requirements under Chapter 1013, F.S.
- Internet Gaming
 - SB428 Oelrich
 - HB3 Plakon (co-sponsored by Perry)
 - Legislation prohibits simulated gaming devices.



Bills to Watch

- HB4025 / SB760 Repeal Local Business Tax (FLC Oppose)
- HB361 / SB770 Exemptions from Local Business Tax (FLC Oppose)
 - Would exempt real estate brokers and sales associates from paying local business tax
- Staff Recommendation The City Commission oppose HB4025 / SB760 and HB361 / SB770



Bills to Watch

- HB603 / SB912 Growth Management (FLC Oppose)
 - Would prohibit a local government from applying transportation or school concurrency or requiring proportionate-share contribution or construction until July 1, 2015 unless authorized by a 2/3 vote of the local government's governing body;
 - Development must obtain a certificate of occupancy by July 1, 2016 to retain exemption;
 - Could result in a significant impact to the city's transportation funding through the TCEA.
- Staff Recommendation The City
 Commission oppose HB603 / SB912
