1	ORDINANCE NO. 130319
2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending the Land Development Code to provide regulations for food truck special events as part of a zoning district's applicable special event permitting process; by adding new definitions to Section 30-23. <i>Definitions</i> ; by creating Section 30-125. <i>Food truck special events</i> ; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.
11	WHEREAS, notice was given as required by law that the text of the Land Development
12	Code of the City of Gainesville, Florida, be amended and a public hearing was then held by the
13	City Plan Board on August 22, 2013, and by the City Commission on November 21, 2013; and
14	WHEREAS, pursuant to law, an advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10
15	inches long was placed in a newspaper of general circulation and provided the public with at
16	least seven (7) days' advance notice of the first public hearing to be held in the City Hall
17	Auditorium, located on the first floor of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and
18	WHEREAS, a second advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10 inches long
19	was placed in the aforesaid newspaper and provided the public with at least five (5) days'
20	advance notice of the second public hearing to be held in the City Hall Auditorium, located on
21	the first floor of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and
22	WHEREAS, public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices described
23	above at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were,
24	in fact, heard.
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
26	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
27	Section 1. Subsection 30-23(c) of the Land Development Code is amended to add the
28	following definitions. Except as amended herein, the remainder of subsection 30-23(c) remains

1 in full force and effect.

Sec. 30-23 (c). - Definitions.

 Food truck means a motorized vehicle that a natural person or business entity uses to sell immediately consumable food products and non-alcoholic beverage items from a fixed location.

A food truck is one type of itinerant food vendor regulated under Article IV of Chapter 19 of the Code of Ordinances.

 Special event means a temporary meeting, activity, gathering, or group of persons or vehicles, or a combination thereof, having a common purpose, design, or goal that will affect or impact the ordinary and normal use by the general public upon any public or private facility, street, sidewalk, alley, public or private area, or building where the event substantially inhibits the usual flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, and is not the type approved for, or customarily associated with, the site upon which the event is located.

Section 2. A new Section 30-125 is created and added to the Land Development Code.

Section 30-125. Food truck special events.

- (a) Intent. The intent of this specially regulated use is to allow and provide regulations for food truck special events on private property. A food truck special event is characterized as two or more food trucks operating on one parcel, location or development. If only one food truck is operating on a parcel, location or development, it shall be regulated as an itinerant food vendor pursuant to Article IV of Chapter 19 of the Code of Ordinances.
- (b) Food truck special event permit. A food truck special event organizer shall apply for a permit by paying the fee specified in Appendix A and submitting an application to the Code Enforcement Division on a form furnished by the city. If the food truck special event is conducted on property that is not owned or leased by the applicant (such as a common area), the applicant must obtain the written consent of the property owner(s) or the property owner's authorized agent. The application shall include a site layout plan drawn to scale that includes dimensions and the proposed location of the food truck special event area, all entrances and exits to the property, parking areas, bus stops, loading zones, fire hydrants and any other information reasonably required by the City Manager or designee to determine whether the food truck special event is in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Code of Ordinances. Upon determination that the application meets all applicable requirements of this section and the Code of Ordinances, the City Manager or designee shall issue a food truck special event permit pursuant to either:
 - (1) Section 30-67(1) for food truck special events that occur on property zoned business or mixed-use. Although special event permits are generally limited to once every 60 days per location under Section 30-67(1), a food truck special event permit may be issued once every 30 days per location within the CCD zoning district; or

21		from any refuse or obstruction.		
22	(6)	Vehicular traffic shall be prohibited within the designated food truck special

25	(7)	Food trucks shall not exceed a size of ten (10) feet in width and twenty (20) feet

28	(8)	One temporary sign with a maximum sign area of 32 square feet may be allowed.
