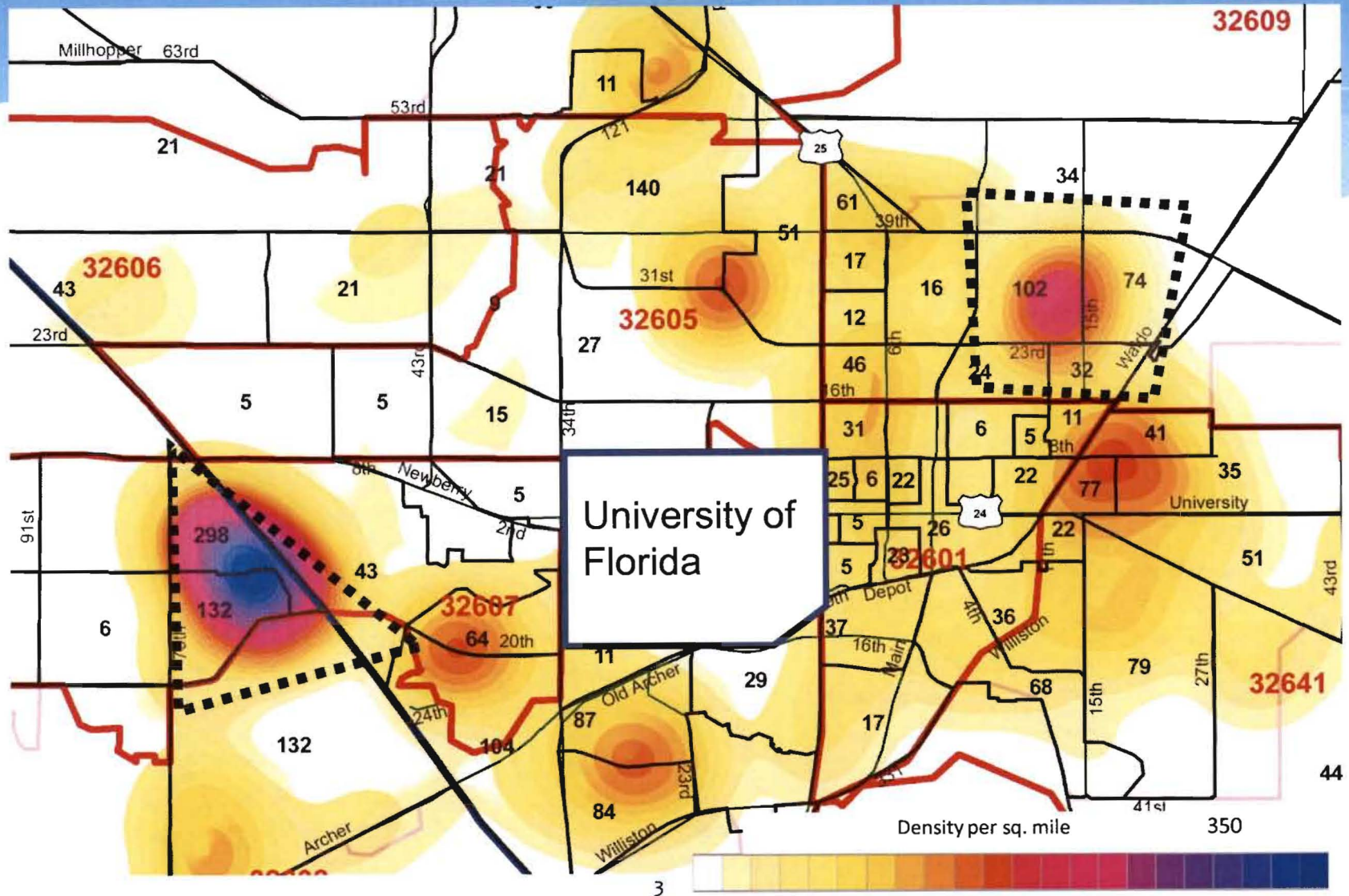

End Products of Community Visioning/Strategic Planning

- * A process that unites partners in working towards common goals and creates a community plan
- * Sharing data is feasible and useful first step to track and trend progress
- * Engages business community in setting vision, objectives, metrics and strategies
- * **COMMUNITY SELECTS INDICATORS TO TRACK AND TREND OVER TIME**

Possible Indicators

- Children born into poverty (Medicaid eligible births)
- Low birth weight
- Teen parenthood
- Children not ready to enter kindergarten (standardized tests)
- Reading and math scores
- High School drop-outs
- Child Abuse and Neglect
- Uninsured children
- Health and behavior risk factors: - BRFSS and YRBS
- Domestic Violence

The Process

- * United Way facilitates and convenes partners for community wide visioning and strategic plan development
- * Family Data Center merges data, creates reports for tracking and trending
- * City of Gainesville provides in-kind staff support
- * School Board provides data support and staff collaboration
- * Alachua County provides financial support for template of *Children & Family Report Card*, requested City and SBAC to help (10/10/2011)
 - SBAC committed in-kind support of Promise Neighborhoods grant, if awarded. No additional funding available within District resources to support data collection by outside agencies. (10/18/2011)

Requested Support from City of Gainesville

1. Contribute to funding the *Community Children & Family Report Card*
2. Continue staff and Commissioners' collaboration of the multi-year community planning/tracking for our children and families
3. Provide grant writing assistance and participation in grant opportunities

Results of Presentation to EEO Committee Meeting (11/8/2011)

- * EEO staff present to the Commission in January and include:
 - Activities concerning community planning for children/families and the *Children & Family Report Card*.
 - City funds spent on programs/services for children/ families.
- * Recommend City provide funding to support the *Children & Family Report Card*
- * Recommend City include contractual language with human service agencies to share data with the FDC
- * United Way to apply for city funds/”community grant” for the Report Card; presently receive CDBG grant for other initiatives
