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ORDINANCE NO. 191120

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida; proposing an amendment to 5.04 titled "Disposal of utilities" of the Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville, to further limit the authority of the City Commission to dispose of certain of the city's utility systems without prior approval of the qualified electors of the city; providing for submission of the charter amendment to the voters for approval or disapproval at the November 3, 2020 election; approving the question to be placed on the ballot; providing that this charter amendment shall become effective if approved by the voters; providing directions to the codifier; providing directions to the clerk of the commission; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

15 WHEREAS, pursuant to 5.01(2) of the City Charter, the City Charter Review Commission can deliver proposed charter amendments to the City Commission; and

16 WHEREAS, the City Charter Review Commission held at least 3 public hearings, each at
17 least 7 calendar days apart, on this amendment, and after which a majority of the full City Charter
18 Review Commission voted favorably on the proposed amendment; and

19 WHEREAS, the City Commission duly considered the charter amendment, had the
20 opportunity to veto the proposed amendment by a two-thirds vote of the City Commission, and
21 having not vetoed the proposed amendment, by passage of this ordinance, requests the Supervisor
22 of Elections place the proposed amendment on the next November election ballot, subject to
23 approval of the electorate at a municipal election; and

24 WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given by publication in a newspaper of
25 general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings in the
26 Auditorium of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and

27 WHEREAS, the public hearings before the City Commission were held pursuant to the
28 published notice described at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an
29 opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard;

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
2 OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

3 The following proposed amendment to Chapter 90-394, Laws of Florida, 1990, as
4 amended, otherwise known as the Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville, Florida, is approved for
5 submission to the electors of the City of Gainesville, Florida, for approval or disapproval at the
6 election set for Tuesday, November 3, 2020:

7 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

8 **Section 1.** 5.04 titled “Disposal of utilities” of Article V of the Charter of the City of
9 Gainesville is amended to read as set forth below.

10 **5.04. - Disposal of utilities.**

11 The commission may not, in any manner, dispose of or agree to dispose of the city's
12 ~~electrical or water production or distribution facilities~~ following city utility systems, or any part
13 thereof, so as to materially reduce the capacity of ~~the city~~ that system to produce, ~~or distribute or~~
14 ~~treat electrical energy or water, unless the commission does so by ordinance with the prior~~
15 ~~approval of a majority vote of the qualified electors of the city voting at an election for the~~
16 ~~purpose of approving the ordinance.;~~

17 (1) electric system;

18 (2) water system;

19 (3) natural gas system;

20 (4) wastewater system; or

21 (5) telecommunications system.

22 Unless the commission first adopts an ordinance approving of the disposition and submits that

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1 ordinance to referendum vote and such referendum is approved by a majority vote of the
2 qualified electors of the city voting at the election for the purpose of approving the ordinance.

3 **Section 2.** The following ballot title and question is approved for submission to the
4 electors of the City of Gainesville, Florida, for approval or rejection at the election set for Tuesday,
5 November 3, 2020:

6 CITY OF GAINESVILLE CHARTER AMENDMENT

7 LIMITING COMMISSION AUTHORITY TO DISPOSE OF CERTAIN UTILITY
8 SYSTEMS

9 “SHALL THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO LIMIT THE AUTHORITY
10 OF THE CITY COMMISSION TO DISPOSE OF THE CITY’S NATURAL GAS,
11 WASTEWATER, OR TELECOMMUNICATIONS UTILITY SYSTEM, IN A
12 MANNER THAT MATERIALLY REDUCES THE CAPACITY OF THAT
13 SYSTEM TO PRODUCE, DISTRIBUTE OR TREAT, WITHOUT PRIOR
14 APPROVAL OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY, AS PROPOSED
15 BY ORDINANCE NO. 191120?”

16 **Section 3.** The Supervisor of Elections is requested to place this ballot title and question
17 on the November 3, 2020 general election ballot.

18 **Section 4.** In the event that the charter amendment proposed by Section 1 of this
19 Ordinance is approved by affirmative vote of a majority of votes cast by the electors of the City of
20 Gainesville, Florida at the November 3, 2020 election, then: 1) the codifier is directed to
21 incorporate the amendments stated in Section 1 of this Ordinance in the Charter Laws of the City
22 of Gainesville; and 2) the Clerk of the Commission is directed to file a true copy of this ordinance

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1 with the Florida Department of State.

2 **Section 5.** If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid
3 or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect
4 the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

5 **Section 6.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of
6 such conflict hereby repealed.

7 **Section 7.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption.


