19	renumbered or re-lettered in order to accomplish such intentions.
20	Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent
21	of such conflict hereby repealed.
22	Section 4. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this
23	ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or
24	unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the
25	ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or
26	application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

1	Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption; provided			
2	however, the rates and charges as provided for herein shall be applicable to all monthly bills			
3	which are for the first time rendered and postmarked after 12:01 A.M., October 1, 2010.
