Implementation Questions

- Staff Education

- Coombs voting
- Approval voting
- STV in multimember districts
 - Cambridge, Massachusetts city council and school board (since 1942)
- Proportion Representation list for partisan city commission
 - Netherlands national legislature
- Keep sequential runoff voting



Educating Voters

- British Columbia proposal for STV
 - Citizens Assembly
 - Invitations were sent to names drawn randomly from the provincial voters list.
 - Citizens Assembly members were then chosen randomly from those who responded.
 - 80 men, 80 women, representing all regions, age groups



Educating Voters

- British Columbia proposal for STV
 - Citizens Assembly
 - January to March 2004 met to learn about electoral systems
 - May to June 2004 Public hearings
 - September to November 2004 Deliberations
 - December 2004 Final recommendation
