

ORDINANCE 050064

0-05-70

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending section 14.5-26(a) of the Code of Ordinances, to clarify that the administrative fee for processing towing applications applies to all trespass towing regulated by ordinance; applies whenever a property owner changes towing vendor and is an annual fee; amending the Police section of Appendix A, Schedule of Fees, Rates and Charges to specify an administrative fee for processing trespass towing applications; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing a retroactive effective date of July 1, 2005.

WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a Public Hearing in the City Commission Auditorium in City Hall, City of Gainesville; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice described at which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 14.5-26(a), of the Code of Ordinances, City of Gainesville, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 14.5-26. Prerequisites to towing vehicles parked on private property; exceptions.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to tow or cause to be towed any vehicle parked on private real property unless the provisions of F.S. §715.07, have been complied with together with the following requirements:

1 (1) The owners of the real property and the towing service shall have executed, at
2 least 24 hours prior to the towing or removal of any vehicle, a written agreement
3 for trespass towing, with a towing service, which agreement shall contain the
4 following provisions:

- 5 a. The duration of the agreement;
- 6 b. The time of day that such towing or removal is authorized;
- 7 c. The days of the week that such towing or removal is authorized;
- 8 d. The fees to be paid for the towing or removal;
- 9 e. The signatures of both the property owner or the authorized representative,
10 and the owner, or authorized representative of the towing service,
11 certifying that each has read and is in compliance with all of the
12 provisions of F.S. §715.07.

13 The form for such agreement shall be provided by the police department, and may not be
14 amended or modified in any manner ~~which~~ that provides for terms or activities ~~which~~ that
15 violate the provisions of this article or F.S. §715.07.

16 (2) A copy of the completed agreement is on file with the Gainesville Police Department.

- 17 a. A new completed agreement is submitted each time a property owner changes
18 tow vendors.
- 19 b. A completed agreement is resubmitted annually, one year from the date of last
20 submittal.

21 (3) Where the private real property is provided for residential parking other than for a
22 single-family residence, the agreement, except as provided in section 14.5-
23 26(a)(4), shall not authorize the towing service to tow away or remove any

1 vehicle without a verified request to remove the specific vehicle by the property
2 owner or an authorized representative. A property owner's representative may
3 include a resident manager, a property manager or other agent who has the legal
4 authority to bind the owner, but may not be an officer, employee or agent of a
5 towing service.

6 (4) Owners of properties used for residential purposes may elect to authorize the
7 towing service to tow away or remove vehicles without a verified request to
8 remove a specific vehicle provided that the owner first complies with the
9 following requirements:

- 10 a. Signage shall be added to each of the existing tow away signs with letters
11 of the same size as the "tow away" language, which provides the
12 following words: "Roam towing." The sign shall state the specific hours
13 of roam towing or state 24 hours, if that is applicable.
- 14 b. Towing contract on file with the Gainesville Police Department as
15 required by section 14.5-26(a)(1) shall be amended to provide for roam
16 towing.
- 17 c. Lease, rental or property owners' association documents shall contain a
18 notice provision indicating that the residential property utilizes roam
19 towing. In the case of properties with existing leases, rental agreements or
20 property owners' association documents, it shall be sufficient to notify by
21 regular mail, at the last known address, each of the tenants/owners of the
22 property prior to the initiation of roam towing. All amendments to or new
23 leases, rental agreements or property owners' association documents shall

1 contain the provision giving notice that the property owner intends to
2 utilize roam towing.

3 (5) For private property located within the boundaries of the community
4 redevelopment areas as defined in Division 9 of Chapter 2 of the Gainesville
5 Code of Ordinances, signage as required by F.S. §715.07 and §14.5-26(a) above,
6 shall use reflective white lettering on a non-reflective black background. All
7 existing signs within the redevelopment areas referenced herein shall be replaced
8 on or before January 1, 2004.

9 (6) Upon filing the written agreement with the police department as required herein,
10 the property owner or the authorized representative of the property owner, shall
11 simultaneously submit an administrative fee to process the ~~roam~~ trespass towing
12 application in the amount set forth in Appendix A, Schedule of Fees, Rates and
13 Charges. The administrative fee shall be applicable to all ~~roam~~ trespass towing
14 agreements filed with the police department after the adoption of this section and
15 shall be paid each time a ~~roam~~ trespass towing agreement is filed with the police
16 department as required herein.

17 (b) The provisions of this article shall not apply to:

18 (1) The towing of vehicles pursuant to section 3-116, authority to remove vehicles,
19 and section 26-136 et seq "Abandoned, Wrecked and Non-operating Vehicles,"
20 City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances.

21 (2) The towing of vehicles from property appurtenant to and obviously a part of a
22 single-family residence.

1 (3) When notice is personally given to the owner or other legally authorized person in
2 control of the vehicle that the area in which that vehicle is parked is reserved or
3 otherwise unavailable and that the unauthorized vehicle will be removed at the
4 owner's or operator's expense.

5 (c) The 24-hour notice requirement of this section shall not apply where the tow is of an
6 emergency nature and the property owner or authorized representative of the tow owner or
7 operator has notified the police department prior to removing the vehicle.

8 **Section 2.** The "Police" section of Appendix A, Schedule of Fees, Rates and Charges, of
9 the Code of Ordinances, City of Gainesville, is amended to read as follows (all other sections and
10 paragraphs remain unchanged):

11 **POLICE:**

12 *Roam Towing:*

13 ~~Roam~~ Trespass Towing Application process fee (14.5-26(a)(6))47.00

14 **Section 3.** It is the intention of the City Commission that Section 1 and Section 2 of this
15 ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Gainesville Code of Ordinance, of the City of
16 Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this ordinance may be renumbered or
17 relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.

18 **Section 4.** If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or
19 unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the
20 validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

21 **Section 5.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of
22 such conflict hereby repealed.

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1 **Section 6.** This ordinance shall take effect retroactive to July 1, 2005.
