- And routinely communicate status


Risks for poor outcomes

- Low birth weight and pre-term birth
- Obesity
- Asthma
- Maternal depression
- Poor parenting practices
- Unsafe neighborhood

- Poor mental health and social-emotional development
- In child welfare system
- Exposed to family or community violence
- Not ready for school

 Early care and education opportunities in nurturing environments where children can learn what they need to succeed in school and life

Family

 Economic environments and parenting practices that ensure children have stable and nurturing relationships with caring adults

Comprehensive health services

 Early identification, assessment and appropriate services for children with special health care needs, disabilities, or developmental delays Health

Community

 Safe and supportive neighborhoods with familyfriendly amenities
