# What is a HOD?

- **Overlay District**
- **Existing zoning regulations remain**
- **Additional regulations & protections**
  - Exterior aesthetics & design
- **Usually limited to single-family areas**
- **Reaction to:**
  - Loss of character
  - Demolitions
  - Incompatible development

# Proposed Ordinance

- Establishes district
- Purpose, intent & objectives
- Criteria
- Procedures
- Regulated elements
- Not regulated elements

# Past Actions

- Plan Board voted 5-1 to recommend approval
- City Commission voted 7-0 to approve the petition with amendments
  - Agreement of majority of homesteaded owners
  - Board of district residents
  - Remove color & plants from list of potentially regulated elements

# Applicant

- Must own property in district
- Agreement of majority of homesteaded owners

# Processed as a Rezoning

- Neighborhood workshop
- Public Notice
- Public Hearings
  - Plan Board and City Commission
- Application Fees
  - Currently \$2,929.50 outside enterprise zones
  - Currently \$1,464.75 within enterprise zones

# Justification Study

- Design standards analysis
- Based on data and analysis
- Required of all overlays
- Documents conditions
- Provided by applicant
- Staff is preparing guides to help
- NPP now covers these studies

# CPB & CC Decisions

- May consider other data & analysis presented
- May adopt other boundaries & regulations
- Must be based on data & analysis



# Necessary Findings

- The area is architecturally special/unique
- The characteristics are threatened
- The regulations protect the characteristics

# More Key Points

- Evaluating Board
  - New Board of district residents
- Each HOD unique regulations
- HOD prevails

# More Key Points

- Only applies to 1- & 2-family residences
- Limited to SF zoning districts
- Minimum of 25 parcels/HOD
  - Same as RPOD
  - 2 or 3 blocks
- City Commission may repeal a district

- Approve 1<sup>st</sup> Reading of Ordinance
