To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is written in support of Mr. Otto Ingram who was initially seen by therapist June 12, 2006 for marital counseling. Client had received counseling prior to this through The University of Florida's Employee Assistance Program.

The couple has been in counseling since that time and continues to come for supportive counseling bi-monthly. The focus of their therapy sessions continue to focus on the following:

- (A) Communication (i.e., become a good listener and discussing concerns rather than avoiding or not resolving issues)
- (B) Letting go of past issues (e.g., wrongs and/or hurts)
- (C) Issues of control
- (D) Spending quality time together
- (E) Approaching their children and extended family members as a team with regards to making decisions

The Ingram's sessions began with weekly then bi-weekly sessions to assist the couple in reaching their therapeutic goals and to help them reunite their family due to the legal stipulations that had been placed on the couple. The couple has been cooperative in keeping their appointments and participating in various role-plays and psycho-education to help enhance their communication skills, learns to set boundaries with significant family members and avoid further conflict that would hinder their chances of successful reunification. There has been no indication of substance abuse or use by Otto Ingram, nor abuse of any other kind such as physical, verbal, or mental abuse toward his spouse Joy Ingram over the past 2 ½ years.

Mr. Ingram participated in a 12 week criminal cognitive intervention program on April 8, 2006. He simultaneously participated in individual counseling with Dr. Charles. Additionally, Mr. Ingram attended a daily check-in program run by the Alachua County Probation Office to monitor his abstinence from substance abuse. Mrs. Ingram began participating in individual therapy with Mr. Alvin Butler, LMHC in June of 2005 and continued to do so shortly after marital counseling was initiated. Several letters have been prepared in this case documenting the issues covered during therapy. The primary areas which have been mentioned are as follows:

- a) Negotiation skills and conflict resolution,
- b) The absence of substance abuse by Mr. Ingram in the relationship and any signs of possible domestic violence. So far there has been no sign of either prior concern.
- c) A basic safety plan which gave Mrs. Ingram a pre-thought plan for increasing her level of support and assistance should any problems arise. So far, such a plan has not been needed.

In summary, the Ingram's continue to meet with therapist and Mr. Butler, LMHC on a bi-monthly basis to work on their treatment goals until we determine that counseling is no longer warranted or the criminal justice system concurs that counseling is no longer warranted.


Dear Ms. Fletcher:

As of this time, the Ingram's have continued to attend counseling with our office and make positive strides. The major emphasis has remained addressing marital communications with a "win-win attitude". Additionally, we have focused on promoting a more unified approach to problem solving regarding family, business, and community activities. The Ingram's continue to participate in a cooperative and sincere manner. Both have remained open to corrective feedback and demonstrate using such information in later sessions.

The Ingram's have been responsibly involved in therapy for approximately two and a half years. A review of the couple's focus in therapy includes: (a) enhancement of communication skills, (b) commitment to adjusting marital relationship, (c) negotiation skills and conflict resolution, (d) joint goal setting (e.g. Social activities, mutual friendships, relation with children and extended family members), and (e) the absence of substance abuse by Mr. Ingram.

The Ingram's continue to show consistent commitment in working on the aforementioned treatment issues as observed by Mr. Butler and myself. Therefore, we continue to recommend that Mr. and Mrs. Ingram be given the opportunity to reunify their family.

Dear Ms. Fletcher:

History of Presenting Problem:

In late 2004 the Ingram family was involved in a domestic disturbance which led to the arrest and later conviction of the Mr. Ingram. The couple had been married for 26 years at that time. Mr. Ingram was subsequently convicted of Aggravated Battery and sentenced to a five year period of probation. Additionally, the Court in the Judgment and Sentence placed a no contact provision in effect for couple. A restraining order had previously been placed in effect due to the serious nature of the behavior. At one point there was a violation of the initial judicial order prohibiting Mr. Ingram contact with his spouse, which resulted in a brief jail stay for Mr. Ingram. A case summary was prepared in October of 2006 which resulted in a Court Hearing on March 7, 2007. As a result of that hearing the Court did issue an order on April 19, 2007 which modified a portion of the original judgment and sentence. Shortly afterwards on May 22, 2007, the Circuit Court of the 8th Judicial Circuit, In and For Alachua County, did Order a Dismissal of Temporary Injunction For Protection Against Domestic Violence in this case.

Treatment History:

It has now been one year and one month since that report was written. As approved by the court, the Ingram's began attending martial counseling in June of 2006 and have continued to the present time (almost 1 ½ years). They have attended more than 28 marital counseling sessions.

In terms of additional treatment, Mr. Ingram has completed a Criminal Cognition Intervention Program through Diversified Program Services and a period of individual treatment for several months via the University of Florida's Employee Assistant Program. Mrs. Ingram also participated in individual therapy for a period of one year from June 2005 through May 2006.

Marital counseling sessions have continued to focus on the following issues:


- a) enhancement of communication skills,
- b) commitment to marital relationship,
- c) negotiation skills and conflict resolution,
- d) joint goal setting (e.g. Social activities, mutual friendships, relationship with children and extended family members, and
- e) the absence of substance abuse by Mr. Ingram

The Ingram's continue to show consistent commitment in working on the aforementioned treatment issues as observed by myself and Mr. Butler. The couple has also shown improvement in the way they discuss their concerns and work as a team rather than as individuals (e.g. matters of finances, domestic roles, children and extended family members). Major emphasis have been placed on addressing marital concerns with a "win-win attitude," to help promote a more unified approach particularly in dealing with various phases of life issues. Mr. and Mrs. Ingram also recognize the improvement in their interactions and increased sensitivity to the needs of each other. This realization helps to reinforce the couple's effort to make necessary changes in their relationship. It is apparent that the various role-plays and communication exercises have been helpful to the enhancement of their relationship and lives in general. As approved by the Court the Ingram's have attended a number of joint activities without incident. Those events have included: July 4th Family Reunion, the birth of a grandson, Mother-in-law's birthday celebrations, renewal vows for wife's parents, and church once a month for the past seven months. These outings were important in that other family members have been able to recognize and acknowledge improvements in the quality of the couple's interactions with others.


Recommendations:

1. We strongly recommend and support Mr. and Mrs. Ingram being given the opportunity to reunify their family. Both have been responsibly involved in therapy for approximately two and a half years. The usual length of treatment for incidents of Domestic Violence is approximately six months.
2. We also support the couple continuing in marital counseling for a period of three to six months post reunification if that is considered as an appropriate option by the Court.

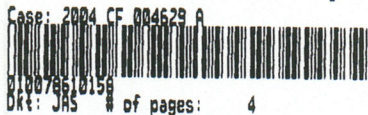
